OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 76527, dated December 9, 1969, authorized Orange Coast Sightseeing Company (Grange Coast) to establish and operate a round-trip sightseeing tour, as a passenger stage corporation, from the Disneyland area in the City of Anaheim and the Knott's Berry Farm area in the City of Buena Park to the Universal City Studios, Universal City, and to the studios of the National Broadcasting Company, Burbank.

Amongst other things the decision required (by Ordering Paragraph 4b) that Orange Coast set a sum of \$20,000 apart from other of the company's funds, and use said sum exclusively for the establishment and operation of the authorized tour.

By Petition for Modification filed May 15, 1972, Orange Coast seeks deletion of this requirement. It states that it has been operating the tour continuously since April 16, 1970; that the tour has been financially successful, and there no longer is any need to maintain the fund of \$20,000 as a guarantee for the tour's continuation.

According to financial data which Crange Coast submitted in support of its request, Orange Coast's revenues, expenses and net income for the year 1971 were as follows:

The fund of \$20,000 was derived from an advance from Orange Coast's parent company, Airport Service, Inc. It is evident from Orange Coast's balance sheet as of December 31, 1971, that the company has the capability of repaying the advance without seriously impairing its financial position. It is also evident from comparison of the company's revenue and expense figures for 1971 with those for 1969 that the company's earning position has improved substantially during the past three years.

In the circumstances we find that retention of the fund of \$20,000 to assure the establishment and operation of the Universal City Studios/ National Broadcasting Company Studios tour is no longer warranted.

Public hearing on this matter is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that Ordering Paragraph 4b of Decision No. 76527, dated December 9, 1969, in Application No. 49730 is hereby canceled.

In all other respects the provisions of Decision No. 76527, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
