## OPINTON

Di Salvo Trucking Co., presently rendering service as a highway comon carrier between various points within the state for the transportation of general comodities, with certain exceptions, moving in intrastate, interstate and foreign comerce, requests authority to extend service as follows:
I. Interstate 5 between Wheeler Ridge and Iracy and points and places within 20 miles laterally thereof.
2. Increase the present lateral authority between San Francisco and Los Angeles via U. S. Highways 101 and 101-A from 10 wiles to points and places within 15 miles thereof.
3. Increase the presenc laceral authority becween Fresno and Sacramento via U. S. Highway 59 from five miles to points and places within 20 miles thereof.
Copies of the application were served upon existing carriexs with which the proposed service might compete and an appropziate notice was filed. n othe Federal Register. No protest has been received.

It is alleged that applicant has been providing service In intrastate and interstate comerce for the general public for many years along the routes where it is presently cercificated; that the new routes along which it here seeks to serve are fmediately connected with and imediately adjacent to those which it is presently authorized to serve; that the extension will permit applicant to
meet the needs and requests of its present shippers at those adjacent and intermediate points which constitute a part of its present service area and will thus enable it to provide a more complete certificated coverage in the present service area for its shippers; and that the completion of Interstate Highway 5, along which applicant is presently authorized to serve between teminal points, has opened the lateral area immediately adjacent thereto, which area applicant here seeks to serve, as an area in which applicant's customers require certificated service from applicant.

After consideration the comission finds that public convenience and necessity require that applicant be authorized to engage in operations in intrastate comerce as proposed in the application and also require that applicant be authorized to engage in operations in interstate and foreign comerce within limits which do not exceed the scope of the intrastate operations authorized by the ordex hexein. A public hearing is not necessary. Applicant's operating authority will be restated in the form of a new certificate.

Applicant is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from theix purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be modified or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.

## IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenfence and necessity is granted to Df Salvo Trucking Co., a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a highway comon carrier, as defined in Section 213
of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and ovex the routes particulariy set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.
2. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and obsexve the following service regulations. Fallure so to do may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. Applicant is placed on notice that, if it accepts the certificate of public convenience and necessity berein granted, it will be required, among other things, to comply with and observe the safety rules of the California Highway Patrol and the Insurance requirements of the Comission's General Order No. 100-Series.
(b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and amend its tariffs on file with the Commission to reflect the authority granted herefn.
(c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than thirty days after the effective date of this order on not less than thirty days ${ }^{2}$ notice to the commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.
(d) The tariff fillags made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Comission's General Order No. 30-Series.
(e) Applicant shall maintain its accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with me applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Comission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of its operatrons in such form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.
(f) Applicant shall comply with the requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 84-Series for the transportation of collect on delivery shipments. If applicant elects not to transport collect on delivery shipments, it shall make the appropriate tariff filings as required by the General Order.
3. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in paragraph 1 of this order shall supersede the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 60065, dated May 9, 1960, in Application No. 41335, which certificate is revoked effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 2(b) hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

D1 Saivo Trucking Co., by the certificate of puiblic convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to conduct operations as a highway comon carrier as deffned in Section 213 of the Rublic Utilitines code for the transportation of general commodities, to and between all points and places located:
A. 1. On or within ifve miles of Interstate Eighway 80 between San Francisco and Sacramento Inciludng San Francisco and Sacramento;
2. On or within five miles of Interstate Highways 580 and 205, and State Flghway 99 between Oakland and Sacramento, Including both Oakiand and Sacramento;
3. On or witiln ten miles of State Eighway 4 from Its intersection wteh Interstate Fighway 80 near Finole to and Inciuding Stockton;
4. On or vifitin ten mizes of County Road J-4 between State Eighway 4 and Interstate Eighway 205;
5. On or within ten miles of State Highways 24 and 160 betweer Oakiand and Sacramento, Inciuding boti Oakland and Sacramerto;
6. On Interstate Eighway 680 from its intersection with State Elghway 4 near Concord to Its Intersection with Interstate 580 near Dublin;
7. On or within twenty miles of State Efgnway 99 between Sacramento and Bakersfield, inciudins both Sacramento and Bakersifeld;
8. On or within five miles of State Zighway 99 between Bakersfleld and Los Anzeles;

9. On or within ten miles of State gighway 1 between San Francisco and San Luis Obispo;
10. On or within fifteen miles of $0 . S$. Highway 201 between San Francisco and Los Angeles and State Highway I between its intersection with 101 near Oxnard and Los Angeles;
11. Within twenty-mile radil of Sacramento, Fresno and Bakersfield;
12. Within the San Francisco Territory as described in Note $A$;
13. Within the Los Angeles Basin Territory as described in Note B;
14. On State Highway 253 between Gilroy and Califa;
15. On or within three miles of State Highway 33 between Its Intersection witi Interstate Mighway 205 near Tracy and Maricopa;
16. On State Highway 166 between Marycopa and its intersection with State Highway 99 near Wheeler Ridge;
17. On or within twenty miles of Interstate Highway 5 between Wheeler IIdge and its Junction with Interstate Eighway 580 near Tracy.
B. Between all points and places enumerated in Paragraph A (subparagraphs I through 27), on the one hand, and aill points located on or wition ten oiles lateraliy of Interstate EIghway 5, U.S. Eighway 395 and State Eighway I between Ios Angeles Basin Territory and San Ysidro, on the other hand.
C. Service may be performed between certificated points via any and all streets and highways.

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D. Carrier shall not transport any shipments of:
2. Used household goods, personal effects and oifice, store and institution fumiture, ifxtures and equipment not pacised in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in Item 5 of Minimum Rate Tarifi 4 -3.
2. futomobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including feeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; frelght automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trallers combined, buses and bus chassis.
3. IIvestock, viz.: barrows, boars, bulis, butcher hogs, calves, cattle, cows, dafry cattle, ewes, feeder pigs, gilts, ooats, heifers, hogs, kids, lambs, oxen, plgs, rams (bucks), sheep, sheep camp outfits, sors, steers, stags, swine or wethers.
4. Ifquids, compressed gases, comodities in semiplastic rom anc commodities in suspension in Iiquids in buik, in tarik trucks, tank trailers, tanic semitrailers of a combination of such bigiway vehicles.
5. Commodities when transported in buik in dump trucks or in hopper-type truchs.
6. Commodities when transported in motor venicies equippee for mechanical mixing in transit.
7. Frusts or vegetables, fresh on sreens (not cold pack or frozen).

## SAN FRANCISCO TERRITORE

San Francisco Territory inciudes all the City of San Jose and that area embraced by the following boundary: Beginning at the point the San Francisco-San Mateo County Inne meets the Pacific Ocean; thence easteriy along said County Ine to a point one mile west of State Highway 32; southerly along an Imagnary inne one mile west of and paralleilng State Highway 82 to its Intersection with Southern Pacific Company right-or-way at Arastracero Roac; southeasteriy along the Southem Pacific Company right-0: way to Pollard Road, including industries served by the Southem Pacifie Company spur inne extending approximately two miles southwest from Simia to Permanente; easterly alons Poliard Road to W. Parr Avenue; easteriy alons W. 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southerly along IS. HIghway 395 to the Riverside County-San Diego County Boundary Line; westerly along said boundary Inc to the Orange County-San Diego County Boundary In ne; southerly along said boundary InlIne to the Pacific Ocean; northwesterly along the shoreIn e of the Pacific Ocean to point of beginning, including the point of March Air Force Base.
