ORDER EXTENDING TIME

By Decision No. 80700 dated November 8, 1972, National Distribution Services of California was authorized to purchase and acquire a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a public utility warehouseman. Because an appropriate facility has not yet been constructed and because its nationwide affiliates are not expected to commence until 1973, it requests that its certificate be suspended until ten days after the filing of tariffs and that the time for filing tariffs be extended to April 1, 1973.

IT IS ORDERED that the time for filing tariffs in compliance with the provisions of Decision No. 80700 is extended to April 1, 1973 and that the certificate of public convenience and necessity considered therein is suspended until ten days after filing of said tariffs.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
