BEFORE TEE PUBLIC UTILITIIES COMMISSION OF TEE STAIE OF CAIIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of Distribution Systems, Inc., a California Corporation, Imperial Truck Inines, Inc., a California Corporation, and Shippers-Encinal Express, Inc., a California Corporation, for an order authorizing Distributions Systems, Inc., to acquire control of Imperial Truck Lines, Inc., and for Imperial Truck Lines, Inc., to purchase all assets and to assume substantially all liabilities of Shippers-Encinal Express, Inc., and for Imperial Iruck Lines, Inc., and the existing sharcholders thereof to exchange and enter into a lease respecting certain terminal properties.

## SUPPLEMENLAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 80502, Eated September 19, 1972; in the bove proceedings the Comission recognized the Interstate Comerce Comission's order in NO. MC-F-11391 which authorized and approved Distribution Systems, Inc. to acquire control of Imperial Truck Lincs, Inc.: Imperial Truck Ifines, Inc. to purchase the assets and assume the Iiabilities of Shippers-mocinal Express, Inc. and Imperial Truck Lines, Inc. and its shareholders to exchange and enter into a lease with respect to certajin teminal properties.

Imperial Truck Lines, Inc. has also filed a petition for a change of corporate name. This petition accompanied by a
copy of the Certificate of Mmendment of Articles of Incorporation, certified by the Secretary of State, shows the new coxporate name as "SEIPPPERS IMPERIAI, INC."

The order which follows will provide for the revocation of the certificates presently held by applicants and the issuance of a certificate in appendix form to Shippers Imperial, Inc. A public hearing is not necessary.

Shippers Imperial, Inc. is nereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of propery which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any anount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely pemissive aspect, these rights extend to the hojder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business. This monopoly feature may be mocifiec or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number. of rights which may be given.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A cextificate of priblic convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Shippers Imperial, Inc. authorizing it to operate as a highway comon carrier, as definea in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Cocie; between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix A attached hereto end made a part hereof.
2. Shippers Inperial, Inc. shall amend or reissue the tariffs on file with the Comission, naming rates and miles governing the highway comon carrier operations herein to show that it has adopted of established, as its own, said rates and rules. The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, and the
effective date of the tarifis filings shall be concurrent with the effective date of the transfer. The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shail comply in all respects with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Comission's General Oraer No. 80-A. Failure to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 80-A may result in cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
3. The cextificate of public convenience and necessity granted in paragraph 1 of this order supersedes all existing certificates of public convenience and necessity and prescriptive rights authorizing the transportation of general comodities heretofore granted to or acquired by Shippers-Encinal Express, Inc. and Imperial Iruck Iines, Inc. and presently possessed by them, which certificates, together with all prescriptive rights, are hereby revoked, said revocation to become effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by ordering paragraph 2 above.
4. The authority revoked by paragraph 3 of this order includes but is not linited to all prescriptive rights acquired by Decision No. 73466, dated March 23, 1971, in Application No. 52439 and Decision No. 60235, dated June 6, 1950, in Appication No. 41580.
5. On or before the end of the third month after the consumation of said transfer, Shippers Imperial, Inc. shall cause to be filed with the Commission, in such form as it may prescribe, an annual report of the operations of Smippers-Encinal Express, Inc. Coverins the period comencing with the first day of the current year to and including the effective date of the transfer.
6. On or before thirty days aftor the transfer is consumated, Shippers Imperial, Inc. shall file a
written acceptance of the certificate. Shippers Imperial, Inc. is placed on notice that, if it accepts such certificate, it will be required, among other things, to comply with and observe the safety rales of the Califormia Highway Patrol and the insurance requirements of the Comoission's General Order No. 100-Series.
7. Shippers Imperial, Inc. shall maintain its accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as preseribed or adopted by this Commission and shall file with the Comission, on or before warch 31 of each year, an annual report of its operations in such fom, content and numer of copies as the comission, from time to time, shall prescribe.
8. Shippers Imperial, Inc. shall comply with the requirements of the Comission's General Order No. Bu-Series for the transportation of collect-on-delivery shipments. If shippers Imperial, Inc. elects not to transport collect-on-delivery shipments, it shall make the appropriate tariff filings as recuired by the General order.
9. Whenever Shippers Imperial, Inc. engages other carriers for the transportation of property of Del Monte Corporation, Alaska Packers Association or their subsidiaries, divisions or affiliates thereof or customers or suppliers of said corporations or subsidiaries, divisions or affiliates thereof, Shippers Imperial, Inc. shall not pay such other carriers rates and charges

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less than the rates and charges published in Shippers Iaperial, Inc.'s tariffs on file with this Comission.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

Shippers Imperial, Inc., a corporation, by the certificate of puilic convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to conduct operations as a highway common carrier as defined in Section 213 of the prublic Utilities Code for the transportation of general commodities as follows:
I. BEIWEEN all points and places within the San FranciscoEast Bay Cartage Zone and its extensions, hereinafter described in Note A (1 and 2): (Subject to Restriction Nos. $1,2,4,5,7,8,9,10,11,12$ and 13)

II: BEIWEEN all points and places within the San FranciscoEast Bay Cartage zone and:
(Subject to Restriction Nos. 1,$2 ; 4,5,7,3,9,10,11$, 12 and 13)

1. Sacramento via Interstate Highway 80 , including all points and places on and within 10 miles laterally, including the off-route point of Travis Air Force Base.
2. Antioch via State Eighway 4, beginning with its junction with Interstate Highway 80, including all points and places on and within 10 miles laterally.
3. Stockton via State Eighway 4, beginning at Antioch including all points and places on and within 3 miles laterally.
4. State Highway 24 between Oakland and its junction with State Highway 4, includins all points and placos on and within 10 miles laterally.
5. Stockton via Interstate Highways 580, 205 and 5, including all points and places on and within 3 miles latexaily.
6. State Eighway 99 between Sacramento and Manteca, including all points and places on and within 3 miles lateralıy:

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7. State Eighway 29 between Interstate Eighway 80 at Vallejo and Napa, including all points and places on and within 3 miles lateraliy.
8. Between all points and places within a 10-mile radius of Stockton.
9. Between all points and places within a 20-mile radius of sacramento.
10. Between all points and places in subparagraphs 1 through 9 above.
III. BEIVEEN all points and places in Paragraph II, subparagraphs 1 through 9 and the Santa Clara valley Territory, hereinafter described in Note $B$, on the one hand, (Subject to Restriction Nos. 3, 4, $5,6,8,9$, and 11) and, on the other hand:

1. AII points and places on U. S. Eighway 101; State Highway 116 and State Eighway 1 (State Eighway 1 : between junction with $T$. S. Eighway 101 north of Oxnard to Los Angeles-Ventura County Line) to and including the Los Angeles Territory and the Los Angeles Basin Territory, hereinafter described in Notes $C$ and $D$ : thence ail points and places on State Eighway 1 and Interstate Eighway 5 to and including the San Diego Territory, hereinafter described in Note $E$; including all points intemediate thereto, and all points and places within 10 miles laterally of said highways: including the off-route point of Vandenberg Air Force Base.
2. All points and places on State Highway 99, including Manteca, Modesto, Fresno, Bakersfield and all intemediate points thereto, to and including the Los Angeles Terxitory and the Los Angeles Basin Territory; thence all points and places on Interstate Highway 5 to and including the Sas Diego Territory, including all points intermediate thereto, and all points within 10 milos laterally of said highways.
3. The foregoing service shall be subject to the restriction that points and places on U: S. gighway 101 and State Eighway 118 between Gilroy, but not

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including Gilroy, and the north and the northeastern boundary of the Los Angeles Basin Ierritory be subject to split-pickup and split-delivery service.
4. Service in the above-described territories may be performed over any and all highways.
IV. BEIWEEN the Los Angeles Texritory and the Los Angeles Basin Territory, on the one hand, (Subject to Restriction Nos. 3, $4,5,6,8,9$ and 1I) and, on the other hand:

1. All points and places in the San Diego Territory, including all intemediate points on 5 . S. Eighway 395, Interstate Highway 5 and State Eighway 1 , including all points and places within 10 miles laterally of said highways.
2. Service in the bove-described terxitories may be performed over any and all highways.
V. BETWEEN all points and places in the Los Angeles ferritory, the Los Angeies Basin Territory and the San Diego Territory, and all internediate points via Interstate Iighway 5, J. S. Eighways 101 and 395 and State Eighway 1 , on the one hand, (Subject to Restriction Nos. 3, 4, 5, 6, 3, 9 and 11) and, on the other hand:
3. All points and places on state Kighway 99, including Bakersfield, Fresno, Nodesto, Manteca, Stockton and Sacramento and all intermediate points including a 20-mile radius of sacramento, and all points within 10 miles laterally of said bighway.
4. All points and places on State Highway 120, Interstate Highways 5, 205 and 580, Deginaing with the intersection of said State Highway 220 and State Highway 99 at Manteca and extending to and including the points in the San Francisco-East Bay Cartage Zone and its extension, and all points and places within 10 miles lateraily of said highways.
5. All points and places on State Highway 152 between Califa and Gilroy.
6. All points and places on Interstate Eighway 80 between owicland and Sacramento, and all points and places within 10 miles lateraliy of said highway.

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5. All points and places on State Highway a beginnins with its intersection with Interstate Eighway 80, extending and including Antioch, and all points and places within 10 miles latcrally thereof.
6. RII points and places on State Eighway 24, between Oakland and its intersection with State Highway 4 , and all points and places within 10 miles laterally thereof.
7. All points ane places on U. S. Highway loi, State Eighway 118 and State Highway 1 (State Eighway 1: between junction with $U_{\text {. }}$ S. Highway 101 north of Oxnard to Los Angeles-Ventura County Line), including the offroute point of Vandenberg air Force Base, to and including the Santa Clara Valley Territory and points in the San Francisco-East Bay Cartage zone, and all off-route points within 10 miles laterally of said highways.
8. The foregoing service shall be subject to the restriction that points and places on U. S. Highway 101 and State Eighway 113 between Gilroy, but not including Gilroy, and the north and northeastern boundary of the Los Angeles Basin Territory be subject to split-pickup and split-delivery sexvice.
9. Service in the aove-described territories and cartage zone may be performed over any and all highways.
VI. BEIWEEN the IOS Angeles Basin Territory, on the one hand, (Sujject to Restriction Nos. $1,2,3,4,5,6,8,9$ and 11), and:

1. Coachella Valley Territory and Imperial Valley Territory, hereinafter described in Notes $F$ and $G$, together with Winterhaven and points on Interstate Highway 8 , between Finterhaven and Imperial Valley Territory, and points on State Eighways 86 and 111, between Inperial Valley and Coachella valley Territories, all on the other mand.
2. San Diego Territory together with all points and places on and within a distance of 10 miles laterally on either side of Interstate Highway 5 and 0. S. Eighway 395, between the northerly boundary of the San Diego County and the northerly boundary of the San Diego Territory, all on the other hend.

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VII. BETVEEN (Subject to Restriction NOS. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 11) $=$

1. All points and places on Interstate Highway 3 between Winterhaven and Imperial Valley Territory, includins Winterhaven, and all points and places on State Eighways 86 and 111 between Imperial Valley Territory and the Coachella Valley Territory. (Said points on saie Interstate Eighway 8 and State Eighways 36 ane 111 will be refersed to bereafter collectively as "Highway 6 , 36 and 111 Points.")
2. Coachella Valley Territory points, on the one hand, and "Eighway 8, 86 and 111 Points" and poirts in Imperial Vailey Territory, on the other hand.
3. Imperial valley Territory points, on the one hand, and "Eighway 3, 86 and Iil Points," on the other hand.
4. All points and pleces in the Coachella Valley Territory.
5. All points and places in the Imperiai Vallev Ternitory.
VIII. EEIWEEN the San Diego Territory ane iil points and places on and within a distance of 10 miles laterally on either side of Interstate Eighway 5 and U. S. Eighway 395, between the nottherly boundary of San Diego County and the northeriy boundary of San Diego Territory, ail on the one iand, and, on the other hand, all points and places in Coachella Valiey Territory and Imperial valley Icsritory, together with Winterhaven and points on Interstate Highway 3 between Winternaven and Imperial Vailey Territory points on State Eighways 56 and 111 between Imperial Vailey Territory and Coacheila Valley Temitory, ail suoject to Resiriction Nos. $1,2,3,4,5,6,3,9$ and 11 .
a. No service siall be performed between any two points both of which are located within San Diego county.
IX. Vegetailes, Eresh, not cold pack or frozen, between Santz Maria, Guacaiupe, ocesno anc tompoc, on the one hand, ind Los Angeies, on the other hand.
X. Authority to perfosm the service authorized in each of the foresoing paragrapis may de combined with each other.

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XI. Service to intemediate points is not authorized uneer either parisyaphs VI-I or DX above.

RESTRICTIONS:
Applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Jsed houschold goods, personal effects and office, store and institution furniture, fixtures and equipment not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in Item 5 of Mininum Rate Tariff 4-B.
2. Iivestock, viz. = barrows, boars, bulls, buteher hogs, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, cwes, feeder pigs, gilts, goats, heifers, hogs, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, rams (bucks), sheer, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags, swine or wethers.
3. Automobiles, trucies and buses, viz. $z$ new and used, finished, or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), armunces, hearses and taxis; freight automobiies, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, trade trailers, trucks and treincrs combined, busos anci bus chassis.
4. Licuids, compressed gases, comoditics in semiplestic form and commoities in suspension in liquide jn bulis, in tank trucks, tanik trailers, tanic scmitrailers of a combination of such mighway veinicies.
5. Commodities when transported in buIk in dump trucks on jer hopper-type trucks.
6. Comocities when transported in wotor vehicies equipped for roechanical mixing in tramsit.
7. Articies of extruorainemy or unusual value.
8. Meter can ox can tops, bottoms or ends.
9. Aluminim cicctric cable, with or without steel core.
10. Petroleum products in buik in tenik vessels.
11. Nowspapers, newsyapor suppiements, sestions or insozts (not waste or serap).
12. Nuts, field shelled or rocgh skelied.

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13．Fresh or green fruits or fresh or green vegetables from ficids or point of growth consigned to cold storage planes， precooling plants，canneries，accumulation stations，packins sheds，packing houses or other processing facilitines．

For the purpose of subparagraph 13 above，the following definitions will apply．
a．Cold storage plant：Facilities maintained for the storage of comoditics under refrigeration．
b．Precooling plant＝Facilities maintained for the purpose of precooling comodities for shipment under refrigeration．

C．Cannery：Facilities maintained for the processing of commodities at which the comodities are canned， preservei，dried，frozen，piekled，brined or otherwise processed into manufactured products．
d．Accumulation station：Yards on open areas maintained for the receiving of unprocessed comodities from the field，and accumlation and consolidation of such commodities for shipment to a cannery，winery，cold storage plant or precooling plant．
