SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 80409 dated August 29, 1972, the City of Huntington Beach was authorized, among other things, to construct Center Drive (Crossing No. BAA-519.33) over the tracks of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company with protection to be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals supplemented with automatic gate arms and a crossing width of 40 feet.

By petition filed October 4, 1972, the city requested the crossing width be increased to 58 feet and the crossing be protected for an interim period of 90 days by crossing signs and flagmen. The railroad, by letter of December 4, 1972, concurred with the petition and requested that signals also be installed on cantilever arms due to the increased crossing width. The city is agreeable to this additional protection.

IT IS ORDERED that the crossing width shall be not less than 58 feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that for a period not to exceed 90 days from the date of this order protection for the Center Drive Crossing (No. BAA-519.33) may be by two reflectorized No. 1 signs (General Order No. 75-B) and train moves over the crossing protected by flagmen. Protection in paragraph 2, Page 1 in

Decision No. 80409 which now reads as follows:

"Protection shall be by two Standard No. 3 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) supplemented with automatic crossing gates."

is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) supplemented with automatic gate arms and with flashing light signals on cantilever arms."

In all other respects Decision No. 80409 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
