ORDER EXTENDING TIME

By letter received December 18, 1972, Teja Buena Water Company requests an extension of time until May 1, 1973 to comply with Ordering Paragraph 7 of Decision No. 80070 dated May 16, 1972 in this proceeding. Ordering Paragraph 7 of above decision requires Teja Buena Water Company to install by December 31, 1972 a standby source of water to provide for the reasonable continuation of an adequate supply of water to its customers in case of the failure of the initial single source of supply.

Teja Buena requests the extension of time because it presently serves only seven customers with prospects of eight more in the immediate future. No water shortage or operating difficulties have been experienced.

The existing facilities are more than adequate to serve the existing customers and immediate prospective customers.

The utility's request for an extension of time in the circumstances is reasonable, therefore,
