SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 80820 dated December 12, 1972, in these proceedings provides for amendment of the liberalized packing rule in Item 1850 of Exception Ratings Tariff 1 to include therein provisions permitting the transportation of "adding or computing machines and typewriters and computing machines, combined," when shipped loose, in van-type vehicles equipped with pads and other protective materials, at the lower rates which apply to such articles when shipped in accordance with the packing requirements of National Motor Freight Classification A-12.

This decision also authorized common carriers to publish the aforementioned amendment on ten days' notice to the Commission and the public when it should have permitted shorter filing notice to enable such carriers to publish and have the amendment in effect by January 13, 1973.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that the necessary correction should be made by the order herein. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that Decision No. 80820 should be amended accordingly.

IT IS ORDERED that:


1. Ordering Paragraph 3 of Decision No. 80820 is amended by substituting the following in place and stead thereof:


"3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the fifth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order."

2. In all other respects, Decision No. 66195, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be January 5, 1973.
