SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 80973, issued today in Case No. 5432, et al., the Commission found that certain informational provisions in various minimum rate tariffs had served their purpose and should be canceled. These provisions pertain to the interstate transportation of property which is exempt from regulation of the Interstate Commerce Commission under Sections 203(b)(6) and 203(b)(8) of the Interstate Commerce Act. The decision also provided that Minimum Rate Tariffs 3-A, 4-B, 6-A, 11-A, 12 and 14-A should be amended by separate order to permit economical tariff distribution.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariffs 3-A, 4-B, 6-A, 11-A, 12 and 14-A (Appendices A, C, A, A, A and A of Decisions Nos. 55587, 65521, 67154, 50114, 50218 and 67397, respectively, as amended) are further amended by incorporating:

Eighth Revised Page 5 in Minimum Rate Tariff 3-A; Eighth Revised Page 6 in Minimum Rate Tariff 4-B; First Revised Page 7-A in Minimum Rate Tariff 6-A; Tenth Revised Page 5 in Minimum Rate Tariff 11-A; Sixth Revised Page 6 in Minimum Rate Tariff 12; and Sixth Revised Page 5-A in Minimum Rate Tariff 14-A

to become effective February 17, 1973. These revised pages are attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. In all other respects, Decisions Nos. 55587, 65521, 67154, 50114, 50218 and 67397, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.




