OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 30940, dated January 9, 1973, in Applications Nos. 53707 and 53762 and in Case No. 5432, Petitions for Modification Nos. 724 and 723, et al., authorized National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, to publish, on behalf of

California common carriers to become effective January 19, 1973, National Motor Freight Classification A-13 and Supplement 2 thereof in lieu of National Motor Freight Classification A-12 and supplements thereto. That decision concurrently adopted National Motor Freight Classification A-13 as the governing classification for the minimum rates established by the Commission as set forth in various minimum rate tariffs.

By Application No. 53768, National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, seeks authority, on behalf of such common carriers, to correct certain publication errors in National Motor Freight Classification A-13 by publishing in Supplement 3 thereto the necessary amendments.¹ By the above petitions, California Trucking Association seeks to make the proposed provisions applicable to certain Commission minimum rate tariffs.² Petitioner requests that all common carriers be directed to establish in their respective tariffs such modifications as may be prescribed by the Commission's order in these proceedings, including relief from the long- and short-haul provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code.

Applicant and petitioner, hereinafter referred to as applicants, allege that, since the publication of National Motor Freight Classification A-13, several technical inadvertencies and omissions have been discovered. Applicants aver that it has been necessary to correct these errors by issuing the special supplement

The proposed changes are set forth in Exhibit A attached to the application.

involved herein. Applicants assert that no change in rules, regulations charges or principles and practices would result from the adoption of Supplement 3 and it would be in the best interest of carriers and the public generally that these provisions be uniformly applied between California intrastate traffic and other traffic.

Copies of the application and petitions were mailed to various chambers of commerce, shipper organizations, carrier representatives and other interested parties on or about December 26, 1972. The application and petitions were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of January 2, 1973. No objection to the granting of the application and petitions has been received.

Commission staff analysis indicates that the proposed changes would correct publication errors. However, one of these changes would provide truckload ratings on barrels, drums, pails or tubs in Item 21960-A of the Governing Classification which are identical to those currently set forth in Item 1810 of Exception Ratings Tariff 1 as exceptions to the ratings in said classification. The latter item should be canceled to avoid duplication of tariff provisions. The Transportation Division staff recommends that the application and petitions be granted by ex parte order to the extent hereinafter indicated.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that the necessary corrections should be authorized. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application and petitions should be granted to the extent indicated in the ensuing order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, on behalf of the involved common carriers participating in National Motor Freight Classification A-13, is authorized to establish and publish the classification ratings and rules set forth in Application No. 53768 to become effective February 16, 1973, on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and to the public.

2. The classification ratings and rules authorized herein are approved and adopted as just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory ratings and rules to govern the rates and rules promulgated by the Commission in Minimum Rate Tariffs 1-B, 2, 9-B and 19.

3. Exception Ratings Tariff 1 (Appendix A to Decision No. 66195, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective February 16, 1973, Thirty-seventh Revised Page 3 and Sixth Revised Page 27-WWW attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

4. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be made effective February 16, 1973, on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and to the public and tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than February 16, 1973, and may be made effective on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than April 17, 1973.

5. The classification ratings and rules authorized to be established by the order herein are authorized to be made applicable also for the transportation of:

- (a) Commodities for which minimum rates have not been established, or
- (b) Commodities which are subject to higher rates than, or more restrictive provisions than, the minimum rates or provisions otherwise applicable, or
- (c) Commodities for which rates have been established based upon Minimum Rate Tariffs 1-B, 2, 9-B and 19.

6. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the ratings and rules authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized

to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the ratings and rules published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

7. In all other respects, Decision No. 66195, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
