THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 69926, dated November 9, 1965, in the above application, an in-lieu certificate was granted to applicant authorizing operations as a cement carrier.

The corporate name thereafter was changed to CAP Transport, Inc., and such change of name was recognized by Decision No. 74693, dated September 19, 1968, and because of its affiliation with other entities an alter-ego restriction was added to the certificate by Decision No. 79387, dated November 23, 1971.

The Commission has been informed by the carrier that certain stockholders have sold their interest in CAP Transport, Inc., to Peninsula Building Materials Co. and it requests that the alter-ego restriction be amended accordingly. Peninsula Building Materials Co., which formerly held 60% of the stock of CAP Transport, Inc., is now the sole stockholder.

In the circumstance, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the necessary change should be made by the order herein. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that Decision No. 69926, supra, should be further amended accordingly.

IT IS ORDERED that Appendix A of Decision No. 69926 is hereby further amended by substituting Second Revised Page 1 attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof in place of First Revised Page 1.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.

CAP Transport, Inc., by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to operate as a cement carrier as defined in Section 214.1 of the Public Utilities Code, from any and all points of origin to all points and places within the Counties of Alameda, Butte, Calaveras, Colusa, Contra Costa, Del Norte, El Dorado, Fresno, Glenn, Humboldt, Imperial, Kern, Kings, Lake, Lassen, Los Angeles, Madera, Marin, Mariposa, Mendocino, Merced, Modoc, Mono, Monterey, Napa, Nevada, Orange, Placer, Plumas, Riverside, Sacramento, San Benito, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Francisco, San Joaquin, San Luis Obispo, San Mateo, Santa Barbara, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Shasta, Siskiyou, Solano, Sonoma, Stanislaus, Sutter, Tehama, Trinity, Tulare, Tuolumne, Ventura, Yolo and Yuba subject to the following restrictions:

1. This certificate of public convenience and necessity shall lapse and terminate if not exercised for a period of one year.

2. "Whenever CAP Transport, Inc., engages other carriers for the transportation of property of CAP Concrete, Inc., and/or Peninsula Building Materials, CO., and/or Calstone Company and/or J.J.&W. Co. or customers or suppliers of said corporations or companies, CAP Transport, Inc., shall not pay such other carriers rates and charges less than the rates and charges published in CAP Transport, Inc.'s tariffs on file with this Commission."
