ORDER STAYING INTERCONNECTION AND REOPENING
FOR FURTHER HEARING

Decision No. 80972 ordered defendant to allow direct network connection of privately owned Divert-a-calls subject to the manufacturer (complainant above) providing reasonable assurances of adequate quality control, installation, and repair procedures. If the manufacturer and General Telephone were unable to agree upon a plan to achieve reasonable assurances, it was contemplated that the interconnection order would be stayed and the matter set for further hearing.

Defendant General Telephone Company having notified the Commission of inability to agree as provided in Ordering Paragraphs 1 and 2 of Decision No. 80972, and having petitioned for stay or for further hearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Decision No. 80972 is hereby stayed until further order of the Commission, and the above-entitled proceeding is hereby reopened for the purpose of considering means to achieve reasonable assurances that quality control, installation, and repair procedures are adequate to protect telephone network safety.

2. Hearing, limited to said purpose, is hereby set at 2:00 p.m., March 26, 1973, before Examiner John C. Gilman in the Commission Courtroom in San Francisco.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
