OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 80381 in Case No. 5432, Petition for Modification No. 704, dated August 15, 1972 added Item 318-1 to Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (MRT 2) which sets forth truckload exception ratings of Classes 35.1, 35.2, and 35.3, minimum weights 36,000, 42,000, and 45,000 pounds, respectively, on certain candy and confectionery items.

Petitioner Hershey Foods Corporation is engaged in the manufacture and distribution of candy, confectionery, and related items. Petitioner seeks to amend the provision of the above-mentioned truckload exception ratings to include Cocoa (72520), Chocolate confectionery (39970), Milk & cocoa or chocolate compounds (73790), Flavoring syrup (75170), and Cocoa butter (72540).

Petitioner asserts that the favorable transportation characteristics described in Decision No. 80381 are also applicable to the commodities which it here seeks to add to Item 318-I of MRT 2.

Petitioner alleges that the ratings set forth in Item 312-1 of MRT 2 allow competitors in the confectionery industry to ship mixed truckloads of the items they manufacture and, in turn,

to restrict mixtures of all of the products that petitioner manufactures. Petitioner's shipments are forwarded to customers that purchase a full line of products rather than those limited commodities now published in Item 318-1, MRT 2.

The verified petition shows that copies thereof were mailed to interested parties on January 19, 1973. The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of January 24, 1973. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed truckload exception ratings are reasonable and that the resulting minimum rates will be just, reasonable, and non-discriminatory minimum rates for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petition should be granted.

IT IS CRDERED that:

- 1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision No. 31606, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein to become effective May 19, 1973, Sixtieth Revised Page 5, Twelfth Revised Page 5-A, Forty-ninth Revised Page 9, and First Revised Page 30-BB attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decision No. 31606, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.
- 3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not carlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

- 4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the ratings authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the ratings published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 5. In all other respects Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
