Application of GREYBOUND LINES, INC., for authority to reolse, modify, and abandon spectfiled routes of Route Group 11, Alameda and Contra Costa Counties; and for incidental relief.

Application No. 53873 (Filed March 5, 1973)

## OPINION

Greyhound Iines, Inc. requests authority to revise, modify, and abandon specified routes in Alameda and Contra Costa Counties.

It is alleged that during the 1957 session of the California State Legislature the "San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Iransit District Act ${ }^{\prime \prime}$ was signed into law creating the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District, which is authorized to operate all modes of transportation in the territory lying within the boundaries of the counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco, and San Mateo; that the District began operating between Fremont and Oakland in 1972; and between Oakland and Rlehmond in early 1973, and plans to inaugurate service in the San Francisco-Oakland-Contra Costa Cownty areas in two phases; that in the first phase the District will on approximately Nay 21, 1973 inaugurate service between Oakland-Alameda Coumty and Concord-Contra Costa County; that such service by the District will effectively replace the local and commtation services presently conducted by applicant in the same areas; that applicant accordingly seeks abandonment and revision of certain operating authority to be concurrently effective with the comencement of the District's service; that during the first phase the District will conduct its operations Monday through Friday throughout the hours of greatest demand; that applicant proposes to adjust its operations to supplement that of the District during the off-hours Monday through Friday and on Saturdays,

Sundays, and holidays; and that in place of the abandonment of its Route 11.07 between Martinez and Lafayette by way of Pleasant Hill Road, which is operated on a one roumd-trip basis daily except Saturdays, Sumdays, and bolidays, applicant proposes service between Martinez and San Francisco via Concord so that Martinez-Oakland passengers may comect with the District's service.

The Comission is in receipt of letters protesting the discontinuance of service on Route 11.07. On April 10, 1973, the Comission staff made a field check and the results thereof are set forth in a report, which is received in this proceeding as Exbibit 1. The exhibit findicates that 7 passengers boarded the bus along Pleasant Efill Road in the morning and 7 passengers disembarked along Pleasant Hill Road in the evening. Passengers presently using Route 11.07 along Pleasant Hill Road would have to travel less than two miles for alternate means of public transportation if the route is abandoned.

Because of the mintmal use of the schedules the staff recommends that the discontinuance of Route 11.07 be authorized on the condition that applicant simultaneously inaugurate and provide an altemate service between Maxtinez and the District's Concord station, allowing a connection to Oakland, substantially as follows:

It is further alleged that the District will commence the second phase of operations in late 1973 at which time appropriate supplemental information will be filed in this proceeding.

Copies of the application were served upon the cities and coumties witbin the District and upon the District. With the exception of the Pleasant aill protests no other protests have been received. A public hearing is not necessary.
ORDER

## IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Greyhound Lines, Inc., authorizing the estabilishment or revision of its operation of service as a passenger stage corporation, as that term is defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilitifes code, for the transportation of passengers, baggage, and express between the points and over the routes set forth in Fourth Revised Page 24, Fourth Revised Page 25, and Third Revised Page 105, attached hereto and made a part bereof, as an extension and enlargement of and consolidation with, and subject to all the lifittations and restrictions set forth in, the certificate granted by Decision No. 55893 and in particular subject to the provisions set forth in Section 3 of Appendix A thereof.
2. Appendix A of Decision No. 55893 as heretofore amended is bereby further amended by incorporating the revisions set forth on the revised pages referred to in Ordering Paragraph 1 hereof.
3. In providing or modifying its service pursuant to the certificate berein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following regulations:
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date hexeof, applicant shall file a written acceprance of the certificate berein granted.
(b) Within one humdred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the sexvice herefn authorized and file tariffs and timetables, in triplicate, in the Comolssion's oisfice.
(c) The tarlff and rimetable filings shall be made effective not earliex than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff and timetable filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein acthorized.
(d) The tariff and Eimetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations soveraing the construction and filing of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Comission's General Orders Nos. 79 and 98-A.
4. Applicant is also authorized to reduce its " $O$ " Route buses On weekdays, when the District's trains are operating, so that it will only operate those buses now scheduled to depart from elther the Oakiand or Concord terminals after cessation of service from each of the District terminals in those two cities.
5. The authority granted herein is conditioned upon applicant operating remaining " 0 " Route buses, as provided in paragraph 4, over its present route, except that such route will temporarily be modified to:
(a) Include service to the Walnut Creek BARTD station via Ygaacio Valley Road and North California Boulevard.
(b) Add a bus stop at the intersection of Park Street amd Galindo Street, Concord, for conventence of patrons using the nearioy BARTD parking lot.
6. Concurrent with the discontinuance of service over Route 11.07 applicant shall provide an alternate service between Martinez and the District's Concord station substantially as beretofore set forth in the opinion.
7. The service changes herein authorized sball be concurrent witil the comencement of service by the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Iransit District between the points of Concord and Oakland.

8. For a period of five days prior to the coramencement of service applicant shall post appropriate notice in its terminals and in the equipment operating over the routes berein considered. The effective date of this order is the date hereof.

## ROUIE GROUP 11

11.01 - Between Frankiln Canyon Junction and Stockton:

From junction Interstate Highway 80 and California Highway 4 (Franklin Canyon Junction), over California Highway 4 to Martinez Junction, thence over unnumbered highway via Martinez, Port Chicago, and Pittsburg to Antioch, thence over California Highway 4 to Stockton.
No local service shall be rendered between Sacramento, on the one hand, and the territory of Port Chicago-Camp Stoneman-Antioch, on the other hand, via Martinez.
*11.02 - Between junction California Highway 4 and Interstate Highway 680 (Pacheco Junction) and Concord Junction:

From Pacheco Junction, over California Highway 4 to Concord Junction, to be operated as an alternate route.
11.03 - Between Camp Stoneman Junction and Antioch:

From Camp Stoneman Junction, over Califormia Highway 4 to Antioch, to be operated as an alternate route.
11.04 - Between Oakland and Willow Pass Junction:

From Oakland, over unnumbered highway (Broadway) to junction California Highway 24 (Temescal Junction), thence over Califoraia Highway 24 to junction unnumbered highway (Walnut Creek Junction), thence over unnumbered highway (Mt. Diablo Boulevard and North Main Street) to junction California Highway 24 (Oak Park Junction), thence over California Highway 24 to Concord, then over Willow Pass Road to junction California Highway 4 (Concord Junction), thence over California Highway 4 to Camp Stoneman Junction, thence over unmubered highway to Willow Rass Junction.
No local service shall be rendered between Oakland and Temescal Junction.

Also applies to 11.15 and 11.16 .

From Port Chicago, over unnumbered highway vis Clyde to Concord.
11.10 - Between Borden Junction and Byron: From Borden Junction, over unnumbered highway to Byron.
