SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Decision No. 81352 dated May 8, 1973 in Application No. 53568 denied the request to reduce applicant's National City station to nonagency status. Applicant filed a petition on May 17, 1973 to request that Decision No. 81352 be set aside and the matter be reopened for the taking of additional evidence, or in the alternative that the Commission authorize applicant to move its National City agency to 2200 Harrison Avenue, where it is already located under authority of a Commission letter dated August 31, 1972.

The original agency was located in a large two-story building at 24th Street and Harrison Avenue in National City, which was not suitable for the agent and obsolete for other uses. It is to be renovated and converted into a restaurant. The Commission staff has recommended that the agency be moved to the Harrison Street location on a permanent basis. No protests or complaints have been filed.

The Commission finds and concludes that the petition to relocate the National City agency should be granted and that the petition to set aside Decision No. 81352 and reopen the proceeding for the taking of additional evidence should be denied.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company is authorized to move its National City agency from a building at 24th Street and Harrison Avenue and relocate it on premises at 2200 Harrison Avenue in National City.

2. The petition to set aside Decision No. 81352 and to reopen the proceeding is denied.
