OPINION AND ORDER

Thomas J. Lipton, Inc., petitioner, is engaged in the business of manufacturing and distributing grocery and foodstuff products, including soup ingredients. This latter product is shipped by petitioner from its plant located in Santa Cruz to various points within California.

The transportation of petitioner's soup products is subject to the Commission's statewide minimum rates and regulations named in Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (MRT 2). The tariff provides distance class rate scales applicable to general commodities for which specific class ratings are named in the governing National Motor Freight Classification A-13 (NMFC A-13). Item 74800 of NMFC A-13 presently names a less-truckload rating of Class 60 and a truckload rating of Class 35, minimum weight 36,000 pounds for:

"Soup Ingredients (Soup Mix), consisting of dry vegetables and other ingredients, mixed, in bags, barrels or boxes..."

In Items 360 - 360.5 of MRT 2, group commodity ratings of Class 55, minimum weight 20,000 pounds, and Class 35, minimum weight 30,000 pounds, for groceries and grocer's supplies, as described in the tariff items, are provided as exceptions

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to the otherwise applicable class ratings named in the governing NMTC A-13. Petitioner requests that the exception ratings for groceries and grocer's supplies contained in Items 360 - 360.5 of MRT 2 be now made applicable to soup ingredients as described in Item 74800 of the governing classification.

Petitioner states that it ships soup ingredients in mixed less-truckload and truckload lots with products presently ratable under Items 360 - 360.5 when such mixed shipments are transported in 20,000- or 30,000-pound lots. The soup ingredients presently take the higher NMFC A-13 class ratings.

Petitioner contends that the shipping characteristics of its soup ingredients are similar to or superior to those commodities presently enjoying the sought reduced exception ratings. The petitioner states that soup ingredients have a weighted average density of 32 pounds per cubic foot and a weighted average value of 75 cents per pound. The product is not perishable, requires no temperature control service or other special handling, and has no peculiar characteristics which make it susceptible to damage or theft. The product competes in the same market areas and is subject to similar California intrastate distribution patterns as groceries and grocers' supplies as described in Items 360 - 360.5 of MRT 2.

In Exhibits A and B attached to the petition, commodities are listed which are currently named in Items 360 - 360.5 of the tariff and which are subject to the same or higher truckload class ratings in NMFC A-13 than presently applicable to soup ingredients. A summary of the comparative lists of commodities follows:

Petitioner believes that its rate proposal is responsive to the needs and desires of affected parties and is consistent with recognized Commission policy. In the circumstances it is requested that the sought revision of Items 360 - 360.5 be granted by ex parte order.

Copies of Petition No. 742 were furnished to various shippers, highway carriers, and shipper and trucking associations. The petition was also listed in the Commission's Daily Calendar for May 15, 1973. A Commission Transportation Division staff analysis of the petition indicates that the sought relief may be granted by ex parte order. The California Trucking Association has also informed the Commission that it has no objection to ex parte consideration of this matter. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that the establishment of the proposed exception ratings for soup ingredients are reasonable and that the resulting rates will be just, reasonable, and nondiscriminatory minimum rates for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that Petition for Modification No. 748 in Case No. 5432 should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision No. 31606, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein to become effective August 2, 1973, Forty-third Revised Page 6 and Second Revised Page 37-CCC, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

- 2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decision No. 31606, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.
- 3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the fifth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.
- 4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

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5. In all other respects Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
