ORDER EXTENDING TIME

By Decision No. 79959 dated April 18, 1972 Gibraltar Warehouses was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a public utility warehouseman in 150,000 square feet of space in Union City. Because of delays in finalizing its long-term lease for facilities at Union City, the time within which to commence operations was extended to January 3, 1973 by Decision No. 80290 dated July 25, 1972 and was subsequently extended to July 31, 1973 by Decision No. 80950 dated January 9, 1973. Because of unusually heavy rains during the month of March, construction of the warehouse building was delayed and is not expected to be completed by July 31, 1973. Applicant requests that the time within which to commence operations be extended to October 31, 1973.

IT IS ORDERED that the time within which to commence operations pursuant to the provisions of Decision No. 79959 is hereby extended to October 31, 1973.
