O P I N I O N

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company requests authority to quitclaim any and all rights, title, and interest within the specific portion of Camino Alto, Mill Valley, to the city of Mill Valley.

It is alleged that on Camino Alto, just north of Miller Avenue in the city of Mill Valley, an adult retirement community known as "Community Church Retirement Center" was constructed; that in order to provide service to the center, applicant secured a right-of-way and installed underground facilities on private property; that at a later date it was discovered that a 30-foot right-of-way, which contains applicant's underground facilities, is to be dedicated to the city of Mill Valley for a street-widening project; that applicant now maintains a one duct conduit system in the Camino Alto easement containing 160 feet of 600 pair cable; and that the city of Mill Valley has requested applicant to quitclaim all of its rights, title, and interest in that portion of Camino Alto to the city.

When the city acquires the property Pacific will provide service to the area pursuant to its general franchise. No reduction of service will occur because of the granting of this application.

After consideration the Commission finds that the granting of the application would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company may execute the quitclaim herein referred to and as set forth in the copy attached to the application.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
