## SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Decision No. 81125 dated March 13, 1973 authorized Walter F. Peters to sell and transfer his certificates of public convenience and necessity as a highway common carrier and cement carrier and a prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman to Peters Truck Lines, a corporation, on or before June 30, 1973.

By letter dated July 3, 1973 applicants request that the time to accomplish the transfer be extended to September 30, 1973 since the transfer of interstate authority has not yet been **accom**plished and applicants desire to concurrently consummate the transfer of the interstate and intrastate authorities.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Paragraphs 1 and 2 of the order in Decision No. 81125 are amended as follows:

1. On or before September 30, 1973, Walter F. Feters may sell and transfer, and Peters Truck Lines may purchase and acquire, the highway common carrier and cement carrier certificates of public convenience and necessity, the prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman, and the related assets referred to in the application.
