FINAL ORDER

Pursuant to a stipulation by System 99 and Yreka Western Railroad Company (Yreka), the Commission by interim Decision No. 80829 dated December 12, 1972 removed a restriction from the operative rights of System 99 pending further order of the Commission.

The restriction imposed by Decision No. 80266 dated July 18, 1972 required all shipments transported by System 99 between points located on U. S. Highway 101 between Scotia and Trinidad and 10 miles thereof, on the one hand, and points south of Redding, including the San Francisco Bay Area, on the other hand, to be physically transported via U. S. Highways 99, 99-W, or 99-E through Redding.

The only protest to the petition of System 99 to remove the restriction was that filed by Yreka. By letter dated June 18, 1973 Yreka withdrew its protest to the petition.

Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that Decision No. 80829 is made final.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
