Investigation on the Commission's own motion into the operations, rates, charges, and practices of PETE J. KOOYMAN, an individual, doing business as PETE KOOYMAN TRUCKING; HALL PACIFIC STEEL FAB INC., a California corporation; PACIFIC CORRUGATED CULVERT CO., INC., a California corporation; and STELEX OF CALIFORNIA INC., a California corporation.

ORDER EXTENDING TIME

Decision No. 81127 dated March 13, 1973 in Case No. 9422 ordered Pete J. Kooyman, an individual doing business as Pete Kooyman Trucking, to collect undercharges of \$9,028.86 from Stelex of California, Inc. The decision also directed Kooyman to collect undercharges from two other shippers and imposed a fine in the amount of the undercharges collected plus a punitive fine on him. The total of the fines is \$12,559.03. \$3,530.17 has been paid. The remaining unpaid amount, which represents the Stelex undercharges, was due and payable on or before July 4, 1973.

By letter dated July 6, 1973, Kooyman requests authorization to pay the balance of the fine in monthly installments of \$1,000 each. He states that Stelex has been unable to pay the full amount of the undercharges within the prescribed time but has agreed to the proposed installments.

The Commission finds that the proposed installment basis for paying the balance of the fine is reasonable and concludes that Decision No. 81127 should be amended accordingly.

IT IS ORDERED that Pete J. Kooyman, an individual doing business as Pete Kooyman Trucking, may pay the balance of \$9,028.86 remaining to be paid on the fine imposed on him by Decision No. 81127 in eight monthly installments of \$1,000 each and a final monthly installment of \$1,028.86, commencing with September 1, 1973.
