ORDER OF REVOCATION

By Decision No. 14404 dated December 27, 1924 in
Application No. 10080 and Decision No. 24647 dated April 4, 1932
in Application No. 17770, Los Angeles and Interurban Transportation
Co., a corporation, was granted a certificate of public convenience
and necessity to operate as a common carrier for the transportation
of newsprint paper.

Applicant's president and general manager is seriously
ill and plans to sell all operating equipment with the intent to
cease operations and requests that its certificate of public
convenience and necessity be deemed abandoned and canceled
effective June 30, 1973.

After consideration, the Commission finds that the public
interest will not be adversely affected and concludes that the
request should be granted as authorized in the order that follows.
A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. On the effective date of this order the certificate of
public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 14404
dated November 27, 1924 and Decision No. 24647 dated April 4, 1932
is revoked.

2. Within sixty days after the date hereof, on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall cancel its tariffs on file with the Commission to reflect the authority granted herein.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
