## ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Applicant held a Class A charter-party carrier certificate which expired on February 18, 1970. A request to extend the authority was filed on February 15, 1971. The file does not indicate what disposition was made although the next entry shows applicant's authority was revoked by Commission Resolution No. PE-168 dated September 19, 1972 after it appeared that applicant had not been operating for months and when letters and notices mailed to applicant were not answered.

The Commission recently received a letter dated May 9, 1973 from applicant's president and apparent owner which advised none of the Commission notices were received because he was out of the State of California living in Kansas and Texas. He advised he is now living in Livermore, California, and requested that applicant's former operating authority be either reinstated or reissued. Protests were received and the matter was to be scheduled for hearing in August; but letters mailed to all of the applicant's present and past addresses in California were returned by the post office with the notation "Moved, not forwardable."

Applicant has failed to provide a telephone number and a current California mailing and business address. We therefore find and conclude that the application should be dismissed.
