SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 81834, entered today in Case No. 5432 (Petition for Modification No. 755) et al., established provisions in National Motor Freight Classification A-13 setting forth rules and practices of carriers concerning the processing of claims for loss and damage and adopted and approved such provisions to govern highway permit carriers operating under Minimum Rate Tariffs 1-B, 2, 6-A, 9-B, 11-A, 14-A, 15 and 19. The decision also provided that, in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Minimum Rate Tariff 14-A should be amended by separate order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 14-A (Appendix A to Decision No. 67397, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective September 30, 1973, Eighth Revised Page 5-A, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decision No. 67397, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.

3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than September 30, 1973, and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff page incorporated in this order.

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4. In all other respects, Decision No. 67397, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
