## OF SUSPENSION AND INVESTIGATION

On November 14, 1972 the Commission issued an Order of Suspension and Investigation in Case No. 9469 suspending to and including March 16, 1973 the effective date of tariff sheets filed under The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company Advice Letter No. 10892; and on March 13, 1973 the Commission issued an Order Extending Period of Suspension to and including September 16, 1973; and on August 16, 1973 The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company filed a substitute for Advice Letter No. 10892, under Advice Letter No. 11120, to permit continuation of the investigation beyond the normal statutory limit. It now appears that a decision in the matters cannot be rendered by the said date of September 16, 1973.

The Commission finds that the period of suspension should be extended; therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The operation and effectiveness of the rates, rules, and special conditions in the tariffs filed by Advice Letter No. 11120 are hereby suspended to and including January 14, 1974, unless otherwise hereafter ordered.

2. The original Order of Investigation under Case No. 9469 dated November 14, 1972 shall remain in effect as to matters considered under Advice Letter No. 11120 to the same extent as under Advice Letter No. 10892.

3. Tariff sheets filed under Advice Letter No. 10892 of The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company are hereby permanently suspended.

The Secretary of the Commission is directed to cause a certified copy of this order to be served forthwith upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, and to mail a copy to Litton Systems, Inc. and to Business Communications.
