OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, General Trucking Service (General) seeks authority to cancel its less-truckload commodity rates for the transportation of Newspaper or Magazine Display Racks between points in California.<sup>1</sup> Higher class rates would apply upon cancellation of the rates, as proposed.

Applicant states it has reviewed its records and has determined that no traffic has moved under the rates in question for a considerable length of time and it does not anticipate any movement of such shipments in the future.

Applicant asserts that increases resulting from the proposal herein would not increase its California intrastate gross revenue by as much as one percent.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of July 2, 1973. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that increases which may result from the proposal herein are justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. General Trucking Service is hereby authorized to cancel its less-truckload commodity rates on Newspaper or Magazine Display Racks from its Local Freight Tariff No. 1, Cal.P.U.C. No. 1, as specifically proposed in the application.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

3. The authority granted by the order herein shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
