ORDER GRANTING CALIFORNIA INDEPENDENT
TELEPHONE ASSOCIATION LEAVE TO INTERVENE

On September 18, 1973, the California Independent Telephone Association filed a petition to intervene in Case No. 9572. The petitioner is an association of all independent (non-Bell System) public utility telephone companies operating within California. The petition states that petitioner and its member companies believe that a decision in this proceeding granting complainant's request would establish a precedent which could have an adverse effect on them. The petitioner, therefore, supports The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company's prayer that the complaint be dismissed.

IT IS ORDERED that petitioner California Independent Telephone Association is granted leave to intervene in Case No. 9572 in support of defendant's request that this complaint be dismissed.
