SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

On October 5, 1973 the Commission received a letter from Continental Telephone Company of California which, among other things, suggested that Decision No. 81896 dated September 25, 1973, was ambiguous in that the decision did not clearly state that the findings on affiliated transactions "were being adopted without prejudice for the purposes of setting rates at this time." The letter requests that "the Commission clarify Decision No. 81896 to delete Findings Nos. 7 and 8, Order No. 13 and the second sentence of Order No. 14 and to amend Finding No. 9 to refer to the present proceedings only."

We will treat the letter of October 5, 1973 as a petition under Public Utilities Code Section No. 1708 to rescind, alter, or amend Decision No. 81896.

After considering the petition, we agree that a clarification of our treatment of affiliated transactions should be made. Therefore, we make the following finding of fact:

The findings under this heading ('Affiliated Transactions') have been made for the purposes of reaching a determination in this proceeding only and shall be without prejudice to the report described on page 23 and ordered to be made under ordering paragraph 14 hereof."

In all other respects the petition is denied.
