In the Matter of the Application of WILLIAM G. MELBERN, doing business under the name and style of AIRPORT LIMOUSINE SERVICE, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate a Passenger Stage Corporation, as defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code, between certain points in Marin County and the Downtown Airline Terminal Building at 375 O'Farrell Street, San Francisco, California.

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 82003 dated October 16, 1973 applicant was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity as a passenger stage corporation. Through inadvertence the order in Decision No. 82003 did not include a paragraph specifying certain service regulations which must be complied with.

IT IS ORDERED that Decision No. 82003 is amended by incorporating therein the following ordering paragraph:

3. In providing service pursuant to the authority granted by this order, applicant shall comply with the following service regulations. Failure so to do may result in a cancellation of the authority.

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate granted. Applicant is placed on notice that if it accepts the certificate it will be required, among other things, to comply with the safety rules of the California Highway Patrol, the rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 98-Series and the insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 101-Series.

- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall establish the authorized service and file tariffs and timetables, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- (c) The tariff and timetable filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff and timetable filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the authorized service.
- (d) The tariff and timetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Commission's General Orders Nos. 79-Series and 98-Series.
- (e) Applicant shall maintain its accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of its operations in such form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.
