O P I N I O N

Taylor-Doyle, Inc., doing business as Taylor Freezer & Cold Storage, a corporation, presently providing service as a public utility warehouseman for the cold storage of commodities in 7,430 square feet of floor space in Sebastopol, requests suspension of said operations for the period of one year.

It is alleged that applicant's lease of warehouse property at 6762 Sebastopol Avenue, Sebastopol has been terminated because the property has been condemned by the city, and that applicant will transfer the goods of its only storer, Safeway Stores, Inc. to other storage facilities within the area at applicant's expense.

After consideration the Commission finds that the proposed suspension of operations would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. After the effective date hereof Taylor-Doyle, Inc., doing business as Taylor Freezer & Cold Storage, may suspend operations as a public utility warehouseman in the city of Sebastopol until January 1, 1975.

2. Within sixty days after the effective date hereof and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall amend its tariffs presently on file with the Commission to reflect the suspension of authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
