OPINION

Santa Clarita Water Company seeks authority to issue a \$250,000 promissory note.

Applicant is a California corporation owning and operating a public utility water system in Los Angeles County. At June 30, 1973 it reports total assets of \$4,745,468, offset by liabilities and common stock equity in the respective amounts of \$2,679,855 and \$2,065,613, the latter amount including \$718,638 of contributions in aid of construction.

The company reports that it has outstanding a \$250,000 short-term note in favor of Bank of America National Trust and Savings Association and representing indebtedness incurred for improvements to its water system and for paying past due refunds on main extension contracts. Applicant proposes to refinance said note by issuing to the bank a new note in the principal amount of \$250,000, repayable in monthly installments of \$4,960, including interest at the rate of 7% per annum.

After consideration the Commission finds that: (1) the proposed note would be for a proper purpose; (2) the money, property or labor to be procured or paid for by the note herein authorized is reasonably required for the purpose specified herein; and (3) such purpose is not, in whole or in part, reasonably chargeable to operating expenses or to income.
