BEFORE THE PUBLIC UIILIITIES COMMISSION OF THE STAIE OF CALIFORNLA
In the Mattex of the Application of EAST BAY DRAYAGE \& WAREHOUSE CO., a Californis corporation, to transfer a certificate of public convenience and mecessity to GEORGE J. PANDOLFO, an individual, doing business under the fictitious name of SERVICE TRUCK IINES, and OF GEORGE J. PANDOLFO, an individual, doing business under the fictitious mame of SERVICE TRUCK LINES to acquire said certificate of public convenience and necessity.

## OPINION

East Bay Drayage \& Warehouse Co. request authority to sell and transfer, and George J. Pandolfo, doing business as Service Truck Iines, requests authority to purchase and acquire, a certificate of public convenlence and necessity authorizing operations as a bighway compon carrier.

The certificate was granted by Decision No. 61448 dated February 7, 1961 application No. 42734, as amended by Decision No. 79868 dated March 28, 1972 in Application No. 53188, and authorizes the transportation of general comodities, with limited exceptions, to and between points in the greater San Francisco Bay Area. Corresponding interstate rights are also included within the proposed transfer. The agreed cash consideration for the intrastate and interstate rights is $\$ 27,000$.

George J. Pandolfo, applicant purchaser, has been engaged in the transportation of property as a permitted carrier since 1965 and as of December 31, 1972 indicated a net worth in the amount of \$128,543.

A copy of the applicarion was served upon the California Trucking Assoclation. No protest has been received.

After consideration the Comission finds that the proposed transfer would not be adverse to the public interest and concludes that it should be authorized. We further find with reasonable certainty that the profect involved in this proceeding will not have a significant effect upon the environment. A public hearing is not necessary. The order which follows will provide for, in the event the transfer is completed, the revocation of the certificate presently held by East Bay Drayage \& Warehouse Co., a corporation, and the issuance of a certificate in appendix form to George J. Pandolfo, doing business as Service Iruck Ifnes. This certificate will not change or broaden the authority transferred.

In the event the transfer is completed, George J. Pandolfo is placed on notice that he may not engage in the transportation both as a highway common carrier and as a highway contract carrier of the same comodities between the same points except as provided in Section 1066.2 of the Pablic Utilities Code.

The authorization granted shall not be construed as a finding of the value of the rights and properties authorized to be transferred.

George J. Pandolfo is placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business. This monopoly feature may be modifiled or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.

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IT IS ORDERED that:

1. On or before October 1, 1974, East Bay Drayage \& Warehouse Co. may sell and transfer the operative rights referred to in the application to George J. Pandolfo.
2. Within thirty days after the transfer the purchaser shall file with the Comission written acceptance of the certificate and a true copy of the bill of sale or other instrment of transfer.
3. Purchaser shall amend or reissue the tariffs on file with the Comission, naming rates and rules governing the comon carrier operations transferred to show that he has adopted or established, as bis own, the rates and rules. The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days" notice to the Comission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shali be concurrent with the transfer. The tariff iflings made pursuant to this order shall comply in all respects with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the commission's General Order No. 80-Series. Failure to comply with the provisions of General Order No. 80-Series may result in a canceliation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
4. On or before the end of the third month after the transfer the purchasex shail cause to be filed with the Comolssion, in such form as the Comission may prescribe, an annual report, or reports, related to the operations of the sellex for the period comencing with the first day of the current year to and inciuding the effective date of the transfer.
5. In the event the transfer authorized in paragraph is completed, effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 3, a certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to George J. Pandolfo authorizing him to operate as a highway comon carrier, as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto and made a part bereof.
6. The cextificate of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision Nó. 61448 dared February 7, 1961 in Application No. 42734, as amended by Decision No. 79868 dated March 28, 1972 in Application No. 53188, is revoked effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 3.
7. Purchaser shall comply with the safety rules of the California Highway Patrol and the insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 100-Series.
8. Purchaser shall maintain his accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of his operations in such form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.
9. Purchaser shall comply with the requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 84-Series for the transportation of collect on delivery shipments. If purchaser elects not to transport collect on delivery shipments, he shall make the appropriate tariff filings as required by the General Order.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

George J. Pandolfo, doing business as Service Truck IInes, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity graneed In the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to conduct operations as a highway common carrier as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of general: commodities:
A. Between all points in the San Francisco Territory as described in Note A and places within 10 miles of any point therein.
B. Between all points jocated on or within ten miles laterally of the following routes:
2. Interstate Hughway 80 between San Francisco and Vallejo inciusive.
2. Interstate H1ghways 580 and 205 between San Francisco and Tracy, inciusive.
3. State Hughway 24 between Oakland and its junction with State Highway 4, near Port Chicago Highway, Inclusive.
4. State Highway 4 between its junction with Interstate Highway 80, near Pinole, and Antioch, inciusive.
5. State Highway. 680 between WaInut Creek and Warm Springs, inciusive.

Except that pursuant to the authority herein granted carrier shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used houschold goods, personal effects and office, store and institution furniture, fixtures and equipment not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in Item 5 of Minimum Rate Tariff 4-B.

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2. İvestock, viz.: barrows, boars, bulls, butcher hogs, calves, cattle, cows, dalry cattle, ewes, feeder plgs, gilts, goats, heifers, hogs, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, rams (bucks), sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags, swine or wethers.
3. Commodities requiring the use of spectal refrigeration or temperature control in specialiy designed and constructed refrigerator equipment.
4. Petroleun products, in buik, in tank venicies.
5. Fresh fruits and vegetables.
6. Sodium nypochiorite solution, and sodium nydroxide solution, cleaning compounds, animal litter (chopped alfalfa pellets), in bags, and laundry bleach (ery) when transported in maxed shipwents with sodium hypochlorite solution, that originate at oakiand, California, and empty pallets returning to Oakiane which was the origin of the outbound palietized shipment of said commodity or commodities. This exclusion does not appily when sodium hypochlorite solution is transported in mixed shipments with commodities authorized to be transported under this authority, except as provided herein, or when interlined with a water, rail or motor carrier for further transportation.

## SAN FRANCISCO TERRITORY

San Francisco Ferritory includes all the City of San Jose and that area embraced by the following boundary: Beginning at the point the San Francisco-San Mateo County Ine meets the Pacific Ocean; thence easterly along said County Ine to a point one mile west of State Highway 82; southeriy along an imaginary inne one mile west of and paralleling State Highway 82 to its intersection with Southern Pacific Company right-of-way at Arastradero Road: southeasteriy along the Southem Pacific Company right-of.way to Pollard Road, including industries served by the Southern

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Pacific Company spur Iine extending approximately two miles southwest from Simla to Permanente; easteriy along Pollard Road to W . Parr Avenue; easterly along W. Parr Avenue to Capri Drive; southeriy aiong Capri Drive to Division Street; easteriy along Division Street to the Southern Pacific Company right-of-way; southeriy along the Southern Pacific right-of-way to the Campbeil-Ios Gatos City limits: easteriy along said ilmits and the prolongation thereof to South Bascom Avenue (formerly San Jose-Los Gatos Road); northeasterly along South Bascom Avenue to Foxworthy Avenue; eacteriy along Foxworthy Avenue to Almaden Road; southerly along Almaden Road to Eillsdale Avenue; easterly alone Hillsdale Avenue to State Highway 82; northwesteriy along State Highway 82 to Iully Road; northeasterly along Tully Road and the prolongation thereof to White Road; northwesteriy along white Road to Mckee Road: southwesteriy along Nickee Road to Capitol Avenue; northwesteriy along Capitol Avenue to State Highway 238 (Oakiand Road): northeriy along State Highway 238 to Warm Springs; northerly along State He ghay 238 (Mission Blvd.) via Mission San Jose and Niles to Hayward; northerly along Foothili Blvd. and MacArthur Blva. to Seminary Avenue; easteriy along Seminary Avenue to Mountain Blva.; northerly along Mountain Biva. to Warren Bivd. (State Highway 23): northerly along Warren Blvd. to Broadway Terrace; westerly along Broadway Terrace to College Avenue; northerly along College Avenue to Dwight Way: easterly along Dwlght Way to the Berkeley-0akiand Boundary Ine: northerly along sala boundary line to the Campus. Boundary of the University of Califomia; westeriy, northeriy and easteriy along the campus boundary to Euclid Avenue; northeriy along Eucild Avenue to Marin Avenue; westeriy along Marin Avenue to Aringet on Avenue; northerly along Arilngton Avenue to San pabio Avenue (State Highway 123); northerly along San Pablo Avenue to and including the City of Richmond to Point Richmond; southeriy along an imaginary Ilne from Point Richmond to the San Francisco waterfront at the foot of Market Street; Westerly along sald waterFront and shoreline to the Pacific Ocean; southerly alons the shoreline of the Pacific ocean to point of beginning.
