ORDER RESCINDING INTERIM AUTHORITY
AND DISCONTINUING PROCEEDING

J.I.M. Corporation operates as a highway permit carrier. Decision No. 81714 in this proceeding granted temporary authority to J.I.M. Corporation to assess a less than minimum rate for the transportation of processed silica sand in dump truck equipment for Ball Corporation from Weisel to the plant of Ball Corporation at El Monte at a rate less than the Commission's established minimum rate but not less than \$1.80 per ton, minimum charge 26 tons per unit of equipment. The authority was granted on an interim basis for a six-month period, pending hearing. The interim authority was extended to May 14, 1974 by Decision No. 82051.

In a letter dated January 22, 1974, Murchison & Davis, attorneys for applicant, by Fred H. Mackensen, commerce counsel, seek to withdraw Application No. 53735 for the reason that J.I.M. Corporation no longer desires to transport the traffic at less than current minimum rates.

In the circumstances, the interim authority granted to applicant should be rescinded and the application should be denied.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The interim authority granted to J.I.M. Corporation to transport processed silica sand in dump truck equipment for Ball Corporation from Weisel to the plant of Ball Corporation at El Monte

at a rate less than the Commission's established minimum rate but not less than \$1.80 per ton, minimum charge 26 tons per unit of equipment is rescinded.

2. Application No. 53735 is denied.
