SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 82396 dated January 29, 1974, Hughes Air Corporation was granted authority to increase passenger fares as proposed in Application No. 53766 and was ordered to eliminate from its tariff, fares which are not applicable to transportation in intrastate commerce.

Through an inadvertence in Ordering Paragraph No. 2 of Decision No. 82396 Hughes Air Corporation is unable to legally eliminate certain tariffs; therefore,


IT IS ORDERED that Ordering Paragraphs 2 and 3 of Decision No. 82396 be amended as follows:


2. Hughes Air Corporation shall eliminate from its tariffs governing transportation in California intrastate commerce all rates, fares, charges, and rules that are not applicable to transportation and accessorial services it regularly and uniformly holds itself out as a common carrier to perform. To the extent that this requirement results in increase in fares due to the elimination of certain point-to-point fares and their replacement with fare combinations, such increases are hereby authorized.
3. Tariff publications required or authorized to be made as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order, on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and to the public; such tariff publications as are required shall be made effective not later than ninety days after the effective


date of the original order; and as to tariff publications which are authorized but not required, the authority shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of the original order.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
