ORDER TO AMEND ORDER OF SUSPENSION AND INVESTIGATION

The Commission having noted that the period of suspension specified in its Order of Suspension and Investigation of February 13, 1974 is in error, Section 455 of the Public Utilities Code providing that the period of suspension shall not extend beyond 120 days beyond the date tariff filing would otherwise become effective; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED as follows:

Ordering Paragraph 2 of the Order of Suspension and Investigation is hereby modified as follows:

"2. The operation and effectiveness of the tariffs filed by General Telephone Company of California under Advice Letter No. 3076 are hereby suspended to and including July 1, 1974, unless otherwise hereafter ordered."
