ORDER DISSOLVING STAY

In Decision No. 80346 we ordered, among other things, that General Telephone Company of California, Continental Telephone Company of California, and all other independent telephone companies made respondents in Case No. 9045 make certain refunds. These orders, together with Decision No. 81212, issued after rehearing, were stayed by Decisions Nos. 81367 and 82014 pending court review.

On September 6, 1973, the California Supreme Court denied a petition for writ of review. On February 19, 1974, the United States Supreme Court denied a petition for writ of certiorari. The stay should therefore be dissolved.

ORDER

1. Decisions Nos. 80346 and 81212 are affirmed.

2. The stay granted in Decision No. 81367 and continued in Decision No. 82014 is hereby dissolved.

3. The computation of time for the independent telephone companies or their customers to do any act required by Decision No. 80346 shall be computed from the effective date of this order.
