Decision No. 82694
BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTIIITIES COMISSION OF THE STATE OF CAIIFORNIA
Application of YELLOW FREIGHT SYSTEM, INC., an Indiana corporation, and SHANE TRUCK IINE, INC., a Caiffornia corporation, to transfer the certificate of public convenience and necessity of Shane to Yellow, and for interim relief for Yellow to lease and temporarily operate Shane authority.

## QPINION

Shane Truck line, Inc. requests authority to sell and transfer, and Yellow Freight System, Inc., an Indiana corporation authorized to do business in Califormia, requests authority to purchase and acquire, a certificate authorizing operations as a highway common carrier.

The certificate was granted by Decision No. 79695 dated February 8, 1972, as amended by Decision No. 81233 dated April 3, 1973 in Application No. 53054, and aurhorizes the transportation of general comodities, with certain exceptions, between all points within the counties of Butte, Contra Costa, Merced, Sacramento, San Joaquin, Solano, Stanislaus, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba and between said points, on the one hand, and points in the San Francisco Territory, on the other hand. The proposed sale also provides for the sale and transfer of corresponding interstate authority. The agreed consideration is $\$ 275,000$ payable as follows: $\$ 79,750$ in cash and the bajance of $\$ 195,250$ payable in three annual installments comencing January 2 , 1975, with interest at the rate of 7 percent per annum on the unpaid balance.

Applicant purchaser is presently operating as a higaway comon carrier for the transportation of comodities between various points within the State pursuant to Decision No. 81573 dated July 3, 1973 in Application No. 53774. As of March 31, 1973 it indicated a net worth in the amount of $\$ 76,211,663$.

It is alleged that applicant seller has experienced serious financial distress and that its principal operating officer has been unable to participate in the management of the company because of poor health.

On December 12, 2973, the Interstate Commerce Comission authorized applicant purchaser to conduct temporary operations under the interstate authority, and pursuant to Section 5 of the Interstate Coumerce Act, the Interstate Commerce Comission by its order dated March 11, 1974 authorized the transfer of the operating authority as proposed, subject to an order of approval by this Commission.

After consideration the Commission finds that the proposed transfer of the operating authority herein considered would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The Comission further finds with reasonable certainty that the project involved in this proceeding will not have a significant effect on the environment.

The authorization granted shall not be construed as a finding of the value of the rights authorized to be transferred.

The order which follows will provide for, in the event the transfer is completed, the revocation of the certificates presently held by applicant selier and applicant purchaser and the issuance of an in lieu certificate to Yellow Freight System, Inc. The new certificate will not broaden or change the interstate or foreign comerce rights held by the carrier except to provide for the rights acquired by the proposed transfer.

Yellow Freight System, Inc. is placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which way be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixcing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business. This monopoly feature may be modified or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.

## ORㅛㅛ

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. On or before December 1, 1974, Shane Truck Line, Inc. may sell and transfer the operative rights referred to in the application to Yellow Freight System, Inc.
2. Within thirty days after the transfer the purchaser shall file with the Cownission written acceptance of the certificate and a true copy of the bill of sale or other instrument of transfer.
3. Purchaser shail amend or reissue the tariffs on file with the Commission, raming rates and rules governing the common carine. operations transferred to show that it has adopted or established, as its own, the rates and rules. The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days" notice to the Comission and the pubiic, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the transfer. The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply in 211 respects with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs, set forth in the Comaission's General Order No. 80-Series. Failure to comply with the provisions of General Order No. 80-Series may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
4. On or before the end of the third month after the transfer, the purchaser shall cause to be filled with the commission, in such form as the Commission may prescribe, an annual report, or reports, related to the operations of the seller for the period commencing with the first day of the current year to and including the effective date of the transfer.
5. In the event the transfer authorized in paragraph $I$ is completed, effective concurrentiy with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 3, a certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Yellow Freight System, Inc., 2 corporation, authorizing it to operate as a highway common carrier, as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.
6. The certificates of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 79695, as amended by Decision No. 81233, and Decision No. 81573 are revoked effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 3.
7. Purchaser shail comply with the safety xuiles of the California Highway Patrol and the insurance requirements of the Comission's General Orier No. 100-Series.
8. Purchaser shail maintain its accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable Uriform System of Accounts or Chart of Rccounts as prescribed or adopted by this Comission and shall :ilie with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of its operations in such form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.
9. Purchaser shall comply with the requirements of the Comission"s General Order No. 84-Series for the transportation of collect on delivery shipments. If purchaser elects not to transport collect on delivery shipments, it shall make the appropriate tariff filings as required by the General Order.

Yello: Freight System, Inc., a comporation, by the certificate of pubilc convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to conduct operations as a highway comon carrier as defined in Section 213 of the Public

Utilities Code as follows:
I. For the transportation of general commodities, subject to the restrictions and exceptions specificaliy noted:
2. BETVEEit the San Francisco Territory, as defined in Note $A$, and Los Angeles Territomy, as defined In Note $B$, over any and 211 routes:

Subject to exceptions 2, 3, 7, 9, 22, 23, 24 and 15.

RESTRICTION: Carrier shall not, without the approval of this Commission, operate as an underiying carrier for an express corporation or transport property for a freight forwarder, nor shall sald carrier publish joint rates with an express corporation or frefght forwarder.

Consolidation of this operating right with other operating righte is prohibited unless and until the Commssion orders otherwise.
2. BETWEEN San Francisco Territory, as defined in Note $A$, on the one hand, and, on the other hand:
(a) Points and places on U.S. Highway 66 between Los Angeies and San Bernardino, including San Bernardino;
(b) Points and places on State Highway 60 and Interstate Higinway 10, Detween Los Angeles and Reciands, including Rediands;

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(c) Points and places on State Highway 60, between Los Angeles and Riverside, including Riverside;
(d) Points and places on State Highway 1 and Interstate Elenway 5, between Los Angeies and Santa Ana, including Santa Ana;
(e) Points and places on State Kighway 91 and Interstate Highway 15 (J.S. Highway 395), between Los Angeles and Colton, inciuaing Colton;

Including service to and from points laterally within three miles of routes (a) through (e), inclusive; and

Subject to exceptions 1, 3, 7, 9, 12, 13, 14 and 15.
3. BETVEEN Los Angeies on the one hand, and San Diego on the other hand. Such authority does not inciude the right to rencer service to, from or between intermediate points;

Subject to exceptions 2, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 12.
4. BETNEEN LOS Angeles, San Bernardino, Rediands, Colton, Highland, Riajto and Fontana, on the one hand, and Victorville, George Air Force Base, Apple Valley, Lucerne Valley, Adelanto, Hesperia, Barstow, Camp Irwin, Daggett, Yermo and Hinkiey, on the other hand.

Such authority does not inciude the right to render service from, to or between intermedate pointe;

Subject to exceptions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 10, 21 and 22.
5. BETWEEN all points and places within that portion of the Los Angeles Basin Teriitory as described in Note C ;

Subject to exceptions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 11 and 12 .

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6. BETWEEN all points and places in the territory composed of the following portions of counties:
(a) Tulare County, west of the western boundaries of the Sierra National Forest, the Sequoia Nationai Park and the Sequola National Forest;
(b) Madera County, south and west of the southern and western boundaries of the Sierra National Forest;
(c) Kings County, north and east of State ringhay 33; and
(d) Fresno County, north and east of State Fighway 33 and zouth and west of the southern and western boundaries of the Sterra National Forest;

Subject to exceptions $2,2,3,4,5,6,8,9,11$, 12, 13, 14 and 15.
7. BETNEEN all points on and within three miles of the following routes:
(a) Between Richmond and San Jose and ail points intermediate and between intermediate points via Interstate Highway 80 and State Highways 17 and 238, and inciuding the orf-route point of Newark.
(b) Between Richmond and San Jose and 212 points intermediate and between intermediate points via Interstate Eighway 80, San FranciscoOakiand Bay Eridge, U.S. iig hway 201 and State Ifighway 82, inciuding Los Altos.
(c) Between San Jose and Sainnas and all points intermediate and between intermediate points via U.S. Highway 201.
(d) Between Gilroy and Hollister and all points intermediate and between intermediate points via State Highway 25.

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(e) Between Hollister and the function of U.S. Highway 101 and State Hicluway 156 via State Highway 156.
(1) Between San Jose and Santa Cruz and all points intermediate and between intermediate points via State Highway 17.
(g) Between Santa Cruz and Carpel and all points intermediate and between intermediate points via State Highway 1 and including the offroute points of Sequel, Aptos, Freedom, Capitula, Moss Landing, Seaside and Pacific Grove.
( L ) Between Sunnyvale and Santa Cruz and all points intermediate thereto and between intermediate points ila Mathilda. Avenue, Saratoga-Sunnyvale Road, State Highways 85 and 9.
(1) Between Saratoga and Los Gatos via State Highway 9.
(j) Between Santa Clara and Campbell.
(k) San Francisco and San Jose and intermediate points via U.S. Highway 101 and State Highway 82.
(1) San Francisco, on the one hand, and Los Gates, Ios Altos, Campoli, Cupertino, Watsonville, Seaside, Monterey and Santa Cruz, on the other hand.

Subject to exceptions $1,2,3,4,5,6,8,11$ and 12.
8. BETWEEN:
(a) All points and places in the Counties of Butte, Contra Costa, Merced, Sacramento, San Joaquin, Solano, Stanisiaus, Sutter, Yolo and Tuba.

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(b) Points in the San Francisco Temitory as described in Note $A$, on the one hand, and all points and places in the counties described in subparagraph (a) above, on the other hand.
(c) Carnier may use any and all highways and roads between the areas described, for operatins convenience only.
(d) No local service is authorized between points located in the San Francisco Territory.

Subject to exceptions 2,2 (see Note), 3, 6, 8, 11, 16 and 17.

NOME: This exception does not apply when the vehicle is crated, or tendered as part of a mix shipment with other commodities, provided sald crated vehicie or vehicie tendered as a pant of a mixed shipment is not transported in epecial truckaway equipment.
II. For the transportation of Class $A$ and $B$ explosives over irregular routes and between the points described as follows:

1. BETWEEN points in the San Francisco Territory, as defined in Note $A$, and Sacramento, inciuding points within 20 miles of Sacramento:
(a) Points on and within 20 miles of Interstate Highway 80 between R土chmond and Sacramento;
(b) Polnts on ane within 20 miles of Interstate Highways 580,205 and 5 between Hayward and Stockton;
(c) Points on and within 20 miles of State Highway 24, Interstate Highway 680 and State Hizhways 4 and 160 between Oakiand and Sacramento; and

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2. Berfuen the Los Angeles Basin Territory, as defined

1n Note $D$, and Sacramento, inciuding points within
20 miles of Sacramento, via Interstate Hichway 5 between San Fernanco and Wheeler Ridge and State Highway 99 between Wheeler Ridge and Sacramento, including points within 20 miles lateraliy of saic inghways, except between points in the San Francisco Perritory, as defined in Note $A$, and points in the Los Angeies Basin Territory.
III. To the extent that any of the authority herein, is cuplicated, it shail not be construed as conferring more than one operating rigint.

EXCEPTIONS: Where specificaliy noted, and pursuant to the authority herein eranted, camper shail not transport any shipments of:

1. Used houschold goods, personal effects and office, store and institution furniture, fixtures and equipment not packed in accordance witi the crated property requirements set forti in Item 5 of Minimum Rate Tariff 4-B.
2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automoolies (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxie; freigint automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailens, trucks and trainers combined, buses and bus chassis.
3. Ifvestock, viz.: barrows, boars, buils, butcher hogs, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, feeder ples, gilts, goats, helfers, hogs, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, rams (bucks), sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags, swine or wethers.
4. Liquids, compressed geses, commodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspension in ilquids in buik, in tank trucks, tank traijers, tank seritrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.

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5. Commodities when transported in buik in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
6. Comnodities when transported in motor vehicies equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
7. Comodities in buik.
8. Logs.
9. Articies of extraordinary value.
10. Fruits or vegetables, fresh or green.
11. Trafler coaches and campers, including integral parts and contents when the contents are within the trailer coach or camper.
12. Cominodities requirins the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specialiy designed and constructed refrigerator equipment.
13. Commodities which by reason of their abnomal size, weight or buik require special equipment and handing.
24. Commodities infurious to, or contaminatine to, other lading.
25. Explosives.
26. Fresh or green fruits or vegetables (not cold pack nor frozen) when:
a. The point of destination is a camnery, accumulation station, cold storage plant, precooling plant, or winery.
b. Transported from the field or point of growth to a packing plant, or packing sked. (See exception)

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EXCEPIION: Except for the transportation of citrus frujts in field boxes or in buik, or avocados, the provisions of paragraph 5 will not apply when the distance between point of origin and point of destination exceeds 50 constructive miles.
c. For the transportation of sugar beets, the point of destination is a beet sugar factory or a rallroad loading dump.
17. Asphalt, natural by-product or petroleum; asphalt emulsion; and, petroleum or petroleum products when transported in buik in tank trucks and/or tank trailers.

Parr Avenue; easterly along W. Parr Avenue to Capri Drive; southeriy along Capri Drive to Division Street; easteriy along Division Street to the Southern Pacific Company right-or-way; southeriy along the Southem Pacific right-of-way to the Campbell-Los Gatos City ILmits; easteriy along said limits and the prolongation thereof to South Bascom Avenue (fomeriy San Jose-Los Gatos Road); northeasterly along South Bascom Avenue to Foxworthy fvenue; easteriy along Foxworthy Avenue to Almaden Road; southeriy along Almaden Road to Hilisdale Avenue; easteriy along Hillsdale Avenue to State Highway 82 ; northwesteriy along State Highway 82 to Iully noad; zortheasterly along Tuliy Road and the proiongation thereor

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to White Road; northwesteriy along White Road to Mckee Road; solutimesterly aiong IncKee Road to Capitol Avenue; northwesteriy alon Capitol Avenue to State Higiway 238 (Oakiand Road); nomtherly along State Highway 238 to Warm Springs; northerly along state Highway 238 (Mission Biva.) via Mission San Jose and Niles to Hayward; northeriy along Foothill Blvd. and MacArthur Blva. to Seminary Avenue; easterly along Seminary Avenue to Mountain Biva; northeriy along Mountain Blvd. to Warren Blva. The Los Angeles Territory includes that area embraced by the following boundary: Beginning at the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and State Highway 1 ; thence northeasterly on Sunset Boulcvard to Interstate Highway 405; thence northerly alons Interstate Highway 405 to State Hisinay 213 at San Fernando (including the City of San Fernanco); thence southeasterly along State fiffoway 118 to and inciuding the City of Pasadena; thence easteriy along Foothill Boulevard from the intersection of Foothill Boulevard and MichilInda Avenue to Valencia Way; northeriy on Valencia Way to Hilicrest Boulevard; easterly and northerly alons Eilicrest Boulevard to Grand Avenue; easterly and southerly along Grand Avenue to Greystone Avenue; easteriy on Greystone Avenue and the prolongation thereof to the west side of Sawpit Wash; southeriy on Sawpit Wash to the intersection of Mountain Avenue and Royai Oaks Drive; easteriy along Royal Oaks Dinve to Buena Vista Street, south on Buena Vista Street and due south on a prolongation thereof to the west bank of the San Gabriel River; southerly along the west bank

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of the San Gabried River to Beveriy Boulevard; southeasteriy on Beveriy Boulevard to Painter Avenue in the City of Whittiez; Southeriy on Painter Avenue to Telegraph Road; westeriy on Telegraph Road to the west bank of the San Gabriel River; southerly along the west bank of the San Gabriel RIver to Imperial Highway (State Híghay 90); westerly on Impersal H1 ghway to Lakewood Boulevard (State Hifiway 19); southeriy alons Lakewood Eoulevard to its intersection with State IIf ghway 2 at Ximeno Street; southeriy along Ximeno Street and its prolongation to the Pacific Ocean; westeriy and northerly along the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean to a point cifectiy south of the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and State EIghway i; thence northeriy along an lmaginary ine to point of beginning.

The portion of the Los Angeles Basin Territory referred to in Part I, paragraph 5, preceding, includes that area embraced by the followine boundary: Beginning at the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and State Highway i; thence northeasteriy on Sunset Boulevard to Interstate Hichway 405; thence northerly alone Interstate Highway 405 to State IIf ghway 118; easteriy alons State
 Boulevard to Chatsworth Drive; northeasteriy along Chatsworth Drive to the corporate boundary of the City of San Fernando; westerly and northerly along said corporate boundary of the city of San Femando to Maclay Avenue; northeasteriy along Maclay and its prolongation to the Anceles National Forcst Boundary; southeasteriy and easterly along the Angeles National Forest and San Bernardino National Forest Eoundary to Mill Creek Road (State Highway 38); westerly along Mal Creek Road to Bryant Street; Southeriy along Bryant Street to and including the unincorporated commaity of Yucalpa; westerly alone Rediands Boulevard to Interstate Hidghway lo; nowhwesteriy along Interstate Highway 20 to and inclucing the City of Rediands; westeriy alons Interstate Hi ghway 10 to Interstate Highway 25 (U.S. Highway 395); southeriy along Interstate Fighway 15 to State Highway 91; westerly along State Highway 91 to State Highway 55; southeriy on State Highway 55 to the Pacific Ocean; westerly and northeriy aions the shoreinne of the Pacific ocean to a point directiy south of the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and State fighway 1 ; thence northeriy along an imaginary inne to point of beginning.

Ios Angeles Basin Territory includes that area embraced by the following boundary: Beginaing at the point the Ventura Countym Los Angeles County Boundary In ine intersects the Facific Ocean; thence northeasteriy along said county inne to the point it intersects State Highway 218, approximately two miles west of Chatsworth; easterly along State Highway 118 to Sepulveda Boulevard; northeriy along Sepulveda Boulevard to Chatsworth Drive; northeasteriy aiong Chatsworth Drive to the corporate boundary of the City of San Fernanco; westerly and northerly alone said corporate boundary of the City of San Fernando to Maclay Avenue; northeasterly along Maclay and its prolongation to the Los Angeies National Forest Boundary; southeasterly and easteriy along the Angeles National Forest and San Bernardino National Forest Boundary to Mill Creek Road (State Highway 38); westeriy along Mill Creek Road to Bryant Street; Southeriy along Eryant Street to and inciuding the unincorporated community of Yucaipa; westeriy along Yucaipa Boulevara to Interm state Highway 10; northwesteriy along Interstate Highway 10 to Rediancs Boulevard; northwesterly along Redlands Boulevard to Barton Road; westeriy along Barton Road to La Cadena Drive; southerly along La Cadena Drive to Iowa Avenue; southeriy along Iowa Avenue to State Hichway 60; southeasterly along State Highway 50 and U.S. Highway 395 to Nuevo Road; easterly along Nuevo Road via Nuevo and Lakeview to State Filghway 79; southerly along State ilghway 79 to State inighway 74; thence westeriy to the corporate boundary of the City of Hemet; southerly, wetteriy and northeriy along said corporate boundary to The Atchison, Topeka \& Santa Fe right-of-way; southeriy along said xigit-of-way to Washington Road; southerly along Washington Road through and inciuding the unincorporated commanity of Winchester to Benton Road; westeriy along Benton Road to Winchester Road (State Highway 79) to Jefferson Avenue; southeriy along Jefferson Avenue to U.S. Highway 395; Southerly along U.S. Highway 395 to the Riverside County-San Diego County Boundary Ine; westerly along said boundary ine to the Orange County-San Diego County Boundary IIne; southerly along said bouncary inne to the Pacific Ocean; northwesterly along the shoreinne of the Pacific ocean to point of beginning, inciuding the point of Warch Air Force Base.
