ORDER STAYING OPERATIVE EFFECT OF DECISION NO. 82629

Decision No. 82629 dated March 26, 1974, in the above proceeding authorized Western Motor Tariff Bureau (WMTB), on behalf of various carriers, to publish an amended rule in said tariff pertaining to the construction of rates on shipments of cement originating at or destined to points beyond Geysers Power Plant. Decision No. 82629 is scheduled to become effective April 15, 1974, and authorizes the necessary tariff publication not earlier than April 20, 1974, on not less than five days notice to the Commission and the public.

J. A. Marino, Supervisor of Traffic, Materials Department, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), has informed the Commission by letter that WMTB did not furnish PG&E with a copy of the application nor advise it of the changes proposed in said application. Mr. Marino avers that the proposed rule amendment would result in unreasonable and discriminatory rates on cement and establish a bad precedent for the transportation of other

The carriers are participants in WMTB Local Freight Tariff No. 17, Cal.P.U.C. No. 21, which names rates on cement for the transportation involved.
