ORDER REVOKING WAREHOUSE OPERATIVE RIGHT

Colusa Glenn Storage Company, a corporation, possesses a prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space at Maxwell.

Worth Bayles, President of the above corporation, has informed the Commission by letter that the utility has not engaged in the public storage business since December 17, 1973, the date it commenced operations as a bonded warehouse under License No. 3-6185 issued by the United States Department of Agriculture pursuant to the United States Warehouse Act. He requests that the operative right be revoked.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that revocation of the prescriptive operative right, as requested, would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the operative right should be revoked and the tariffs applicable to the services thereunder should be canceled.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman possessed by Colusa Glenn Storage Company, a corporation, as determined by the Commission's order dated August 23, 1960, in Case No. 6866, is hereby revoked.

2. Jack L. Dawson, Agent, is hereby authorized and directed to cancel the participation of Colusa Glenn Storage Company from

the involved California Warehouse Tariff Bureau tariffs on file with the Commission, such cancellation to be made within ninety days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Colusa Glenn Storage Company or to mail a certified copy thereof to it at its last known address as shown in the Commission's records and to mail a copy of this order to Jack L. Dawson, Agent.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
