SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. Second entered today in Case No. 5432 (Petition for Modification No. 779) et al. found that the rates and charges in Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B should be increased and that amendment of that tariff should be accomplished by a separate order in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B (Appendix B to Decision No. 65834, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective July 1, 1974, the revised pages attached hereto, and listed in Appendix A, also attached hereto, which pages and appendix by this reference are made a part hereof.
- 2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to Decision No. 65834, as amended, are hereby directed to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein of said decisions.
- 3. Any provisions currently maintained in common carrier tariffs which are more restrictive than, or which produce charges greater than, those contained in Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B are authorized

C. 5441 Pet. 285 (MRT 1-B) 1mm to be maintained in connection with the increased rates and charges directed to be established by Ordering Paragraph 2 hereof. 4. Common carriers maintaining rates on a level other than the minimum rates for transportation for which rates are prescribed in Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B are authorized to increase such rates by the same amounts authorized for Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B herein. 5. Common carriers maintaining rates on the same level as Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B rates for the transportation of commodities and/or for transportation not subject to Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B are authorized to increase said rates by the same amounts authorized for Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B rates herein. 6. Common carriers maintaining rates at levels other than the minimum rates for the transportation of commodities and/or for transportation not subject to Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B are authorized to increase said rates by the same amounts authorized for Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B rates herein. 7. Common carriers, to the extent they maintain rates not otherwise specifically referenced in other ordering paragraphs hereof, are authorized to increase such rates by 5 percent. 8. Tariff publications required or authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the fifth day after the effective date of this order, on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public; such tariff publications as are required shall be made effective not later than July 1, 1974; and as to tariff publications which are authorized but not required, the authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within sixty days after the effective date hereof. 9. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained -2-

under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing longand short-haul departures and to this order.

- 10. In all other respects Decision No. 65834, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
- 11. With respect to Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B, to the extent Petition for Modification No. 285 in Case No. 5441 is not granted herein, said petition is hereby denied.



- (b) Listing and reporting marked weights, gallonage or serial numbers, 3% cents per line, per package or piece, minimum charge 110 cents per component part.
- (c) Marking, tagging, stenciling or labeling, 3% cents per package or piece, minimum charge \$1.70 per component part.
- (d) Advancing, prorating and collecting inbound freight charges of other carriers, 1 percent of amount advanced, minimum charge \$1.70 per component part.
- (e) Advancing or prepayment of outbound freight charges to Other Carriers, \$1.35 per component part.
- (f) Breaking down, leveling off, installing dunnage in pool cars stopped for partial unloading will be charged as provided in Item 110 for helpers, plus the cost of dunnage.
- (g) Storage will be charged as provided in Item 180 when carrier through no fault of its own is unable to effect delivery of a component part.

- (h) Replacing damage-free equipment in pool cars, or any other accessorial service not provided for elsewhere shall be charged at the hourly rate provided in paragraph (b) of Item 110.
- (i) In addition to the other accessorial charges provided herein special handling charges based on the total weight of the component part shall be assessed as follows:
 - 1. For each component part on which delivery is taken at carrier's terminal: 45 cents per 100 pounds, minimum charge \$2.10.
 - 2. When, through no fault of carrier, all pieces comprising one component part are not picked up at one specific time on delivery taken at carrier's terminal, charges shall be assessed as set forth under subparagraph (1) hereof plus an additional charge of 45 cents per 100 pounds, minimum charge \$1.85.
