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## OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B (MRT 6-B) names minimum rates for the transportation of bulk petroleum products in tank vehicles by petroleum contract carriers. By this petition, as amended, California Trucking Association seeks the establishment in MRT 6-B of two revised rate scales for five commodity rate groups<sup>1</sup> in lieu of the five rate scales for such commodity rate groups which are scheduled to become effective July 1, 1974. Petitioner also requests that common carriers be directed to establish in their respective tariffs all such modifications as may be prescribed by the Commission's order in this proceeding, including relief from the longand short-haul provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code.

Petitioner alleges that, by Decision No. 82350,<sup>2</sup> the Commission established a single scale of rates for the aforementioned commodity rate groups to allow tariff users additional time to set up their in-house procedures for handling the petroleum products

in question under the five separate rate scales hereinbefore mentioned. Petitioner contends that the single scale of rates was subsequently increased pursuant to Decision No. 82619<sup>3</sup> to offset increased costs incurred by the involved carriers but that this decision did not provide for similar adjustments in the five rate scales which are scheduled to replace said single rate scale on July 1, 1974. Petitioner avers that the relief sought herein would reflect the findings in Decision No. 82350 with respect to Rate Groups A through E and the cost circumstances found reasonable in Decision No. 82619.<sup>4</sup>

Petitioner asserts that it has participated with interested shippers and carriers in all formal discussions leading to the proposal herein and believes that its proposal is desired by, and in the interest of, said parties.

Copies of the petition and amendment were mailed to various petroleum shippers, carrier representatives and other interested parties on or about April 16, 1974. The petition and amendment were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of April 18 and May 21, 1974. Phillips Petroleum Company and Standard Oil Company of California have informed the Commission by letter that they support petitioner's proposal. No objection to the granting of the petition, as amended, has been received.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that petitioner's proposal is reasonable and the resulting rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges

for the transportation involved and, to the extent that increases may be involved, such increases are justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petition, as amended, should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B (Appendix A to Decision No. 82350, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective July 1, 1974, Fourth Revised Page 29, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to Decision No. 82350, as amended, are hereby directed to establish in their tariffs the increases necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered by this decision.

3. Common carriers maintaining rates on a level other than the minimum rates for transportation for which rates are prescribed in Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B are authorized to increase such rates by the same amounts authorized by this decision for Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B rates.

4. Common carriers maintaining rates on the same level as Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B rates for the transportation of commodities and/or for transportation not subject to Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B are authorized to increase such rates by the same amounts authorized by this decision for Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B rates.

5. Common carriers maintaining rates at levels other than the minimum rates for the transportation of commodities and/or for transportation not subject to Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B are authorized to increase such rates by the same amounts authorized by this decision for Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B rates.

6. Tariff publications required or authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier that the effective date of this order and may be made

effective not earlier than the first day after the effective date of this order, on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and to the public; such tariff publications as are required shall be made effective not later than July 1, 1974; and as to tariff publications which are authorized but not required, the authority shall expire unless exercised within sixty days after the effective date of this order.

7. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized by this order, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

In all other respects Decision No. 82350, as amended, 8. shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be June 28, 1974. Dated at San Francisco, California, this / Staay of June, 1974.
