## Decision No. 83186



BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTIIITIES COMNISSION OF THE STATE OF CAIIFORNIA
In the Matter of the Appifcation of AMERICAN TRANSFER CO., a corporation, for an In-Iieu Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of property in intrastate and interstate and foreign comerce.

## OPINION

American Transfer Co., a corporation, presently providing service as a highway common carrier requests authority to extend service for the transportation of shipments moving in intrastate, interstate, and foreign commerce. Copies of the application were served upon 49 carriers with which the proposed extended service might compete as well as upon the California Trucking Association. An appropriate notice was pablished in the Federal Register on
December 13, 1973. Several protests were filed, but were subsequentiy withdrawn when the appifcation was amended by restricting the transportation of shipments moving to or from points more than 10 miles sonth of Bakersfield to 10,000 pounds or more.

Applicant is presently authorized to transport general commodities between the San Francisco Bay area and Bakersfileld, including numerous intermediate and off-route points. By its application, as amended, applicant proposes to extend service to the Los Angeles Basin Territory, but not locally therefa. Applicant 2lso proposes to fill in some gaps in its service north of Bakersfleld and in addition thereto proposes to transport special commodities, which are required for the construction, maintenance, and operation of high voltage transmission lines of Pacific Gas and Electric Company, within a lfmited area from Paso Robles, Morro Bay,

San Iuis Oblspo, and Arroyo Grande, on the west, to Avenal, Iost Hills, and McKittrick, on the east.

Applicant owns and operates 391 units of equipment and as of May 31, 2973, indicated a net worth in the amount of $\$ 1,983,895$.

It is alleged that applicant has developed a substantial volume of business to the Los Angeles Basin Territory pursuant to its permitted authority; that many of applicant's customers using its service north of Bakersfield also request its service south of Bakersfield; that Southern Callfornia shippers have expanded their use of appilcant's service to the point where applicant's entire operation should now be converted to highway common carrier status; that applicant's present certificates north of Bakersfield require redefining to incorporate new highways that have been established and to fill gaps, such as that on the route between Vallejo and Sacramento; that Sacramento is presentiy bejng served via a circuitous route from San Francisco; that a direct route to Sacramento is available to applicant under its present authority from such points as Fresno and Modesto; that in addition to the need for the extension of applicant's general commodity service, there is an increasing and expanding need for applicant's special service in connection with the construction of the high voltage transmission lines of Pacific Gas and Electric Company; and that this service will require both intrastate and interstate authority, because shipments come from both within and without callfornia and from numerous suppliers so that contract carrier authority cannot be utilized.

After consideration the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that applicant be authorized to engage in operations in intrastate commerce as proposed in the application, as amended, and aiso require that applicant be authorized to engage in operations in interstate and foreign commerce within limits which do not exceed the scope of the intrastate operations authorized by this decision.

The Commission concludes that the application should be granted as provided by the order herein, and that applicant's operating authority should be restated in the form of a new certificate. The territorial description or routes of the authoirty granted reflects the names of redesignated highways and roads and does not in any way exceed the geographical scope of the proposed operation as published in the Federal Register. A public hearing is not necessary.

We find with reasonable certainty that the project involved in this proceeding will not. have a significant effect on the environment.

Applicant is placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consider ation for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business. This monopoly feature may be modified or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.

II IS ORDERED that:
2. A certiflcate of public convenience and necessity is granted to American Transfer Co., a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a highway common carrier, as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.
2. In providing service pursuant to the authority granted by this order, applicant shall comply with the following service reguiations. Faflure so to do may result in cancellation of the autbority.
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall file a written
acceptance of the certificate granted. Applicant is placed on notice that if it accepts the certificate it will be required, among other things, to comply with the safety rules of the Calffornia Eighway Patrol and the fnsurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 100-Series.
(b) WIthin one hundred twenty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall establish the authorized service and amend or fille tariffs, in triplicate, $n$ the Comission's office.
(c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than thirty days after the effective date of this order on not less than thirty days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the authorized service.
(d) The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Comrssion's Ceneral Order No. 80-Series.
(e) Applicant shall maintain its accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the appizcable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accoints as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, $2 n$ annual report of its operations in such form, content, and number of copies as the commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.
(f) Applicant shall comply with the requirements of the Comission's General Order No. 84-Series for the transportation of collect on delivery shipments. If applicant elects not to transport collect on delivery shrpments, it shall make the appropriate tariff filings as required by the General Order.
3. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in paragraph 1 of this order shall supersede the certificates of public convenience and necessity granted by the following decisions, which certificates are revoked effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff fillings required by paragraph $2(b)=$

American Transfer Co., by the certificate of publice convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to conduct operations as a highway common carrier as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the folloring transportation:

2. Autonobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jceps), ambinlances, hearses and taxis; freight automoblles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
3. Investock, viz.: bamows, boars, balls, butcher hogs, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, feeder piss, gilts, goats, helfers, hogs, kids, lambs, oxen, p15s, rams (bucks), sheep, sieep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags, swine or wethers.
4. Liquids, compressed gases, comodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
