## ORDER REVOKING WAREHOUSE OPERATIVE RIGHT

Salyer Grain and Milling Co., a corporation, possesses a prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space at Corcoran and vicinity.

C. Everette Salyer, President of the corporation, has informed the Commission by letter that the utility is currently operating under License No. 3-6249 issued by the United States Department of Agriculture pursuant to the United States Warehouse Act. He states that there is little likelihood that the utility will engage in public storage operations in the future and requests that the operative right be revoked.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that revocation of the warehouse operative right, as requested, would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the warehouse operative right should be revoked and the tariff applicable to the services thereunder should be canceled.

## IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman possessed by Salyer Grain and Milling Co., a corporation, as determined by the Commission's order dated August 9, 1960, in Case No. 6788, is hereby revoked.

2. Salyer Grain and Milling Company Warehouse Tariff No. 1, Cal.P.U.C. No. 1, is hereby canceled.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Salyer Grain and Milling Co., a corporation, or to mail a certified copy thereof to it at its last known address as shown in the Commission's records and to mail a copy of this order to Jack L. Dawson, Agent.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
