ORDER REVOKING WAREHOUSE OPERATIVE RIGHT

Tyndall Warehouse Company, Inc., a corporation, possesses a prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space at Tyndall Mound and vicinity in Yolo County.

Harry A. Helin, Jr., President of the corporation, has informed the Commission by letter that the utility has not engaged in the public storage business since June 1, 1974, the date it commenced operations as a bonded warehouse under License No. 3-6258 issued by the United States Department of Agriculture pursuant to the United States Warehouse Act. He requests that the operative right be revoked.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that revocation of the warehouse operative right, as requested, would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the warehouse operative right should be revoked and the tariff applicable to the services thereunder should be canceled.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman possessed by Tyndall Warehouse Company, Inc., a corporation, as determined by the Commission's order dated August 1, 1960, in Case No. 6699, is hereby revoked.

2. Jack L. Dawson, Agent, is hereby authorized and directed to cancel the participation of Tyndall Warehouse Company, Inc., from the involved tariffs of California Warehouse Tariff Bureau on file with the Commission, such cancellation to be made within 90 days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Tyndall Warehouse Company, Inc., or to mail a certified copy thereof to it at its last known address as shown in the Commission's records and to mail a copy of this order to Jack L. Dawson, Agent.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
