O P I N I O N

Lyon Moving & Storage Co. requests authority to suspend warehouse activities at La Mesa for a period of one year.

Applicant is engaged in business as a warehouseman, as defined by Section 239 of the Public Utilities Code of the State of California, conducting such activities at various locations within the State under authority issued by this Commission pursuant to Section 1051 of said Code. In such connection, for a number of years past it has been conducting public utility warehouseman operations under a prescriptive operative right at 8300 Center Drive in the city of La Mesa pursuant to prescriptive operative rights originally granted by order dated September 1, 1960 in Case No. 6944. (See Decision No. 81634 dated July 24, 1973.) The facilities located at the indicated address have been leased. Such lease has now expired. Applicant has been unable to acquire suitable new lease facilities within the immediate area and, as a consequence, finds it necessary to request suspension of said prescriptive operative right insofar as it authorizes public utility warehousing activities at La Mesa. It is applicant's intention to reinstitute warehousing activities shortly in the vicinity of La Mesa, either in a warehouse facility to be purchased by applicant or in leased facilities if suitable accommodations can be found.

There were no protests.

After consideration the Commission finds that the public interest will not be adversely affected if applicant's request is

granted and concludes that it should be authorized to suspend its warehouseman operations at La Mesa.

A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Applicant's operating authority as a public utility warehouseman in La Mesa is suspended for a period of one year from the effective date of this order.

2. Within sixty days after the effective date hereof and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall amend its tariffs presently on file with this Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

3. The Secretary is directed to mail a copy of this order to Jack L. Dawson, Agent.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
