In the matter of the application of Turf Transport, Inc. to sell and transfer a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the transportation of cement to Ortiz Brothers, Trucking, Inc.

Application No. 54887 (Filed May 17, 1974)

## OPINION

Turf Transport, Inc. requests authority to sell and transfer, and Ortiz Brothers Trucking, Inc., a California corporation, requests authority to purchase and acquire, a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a cement carrier.

The certificate was granted by Decision No. 75501 dated April 1, 1969 in Application No. 50849 and authorizes the transportation of shipments of cement to and within all points in the counties of Santa Barbara and Ventura. The agreed cash consideration is \$5,000.

Applicant purchaser is presently operating as a permitted carrier. It owns and operates 59 units of equipment and as of December 31, 1973 indicated a net worth in the amount of \$131,873.

After consideration the Commission finds that the proposed transfer would not be adverse to the public interest and concludes that it should be authorized. We find with reasonable certainty that the project involved in this proceeding will not have a significant effect on the environment. A public hearing is not necessary.

8. Purchaser shall comply with the requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 84-Series for the transportation of collect on delivery shipments. If purchaser elects not to transport collect on delivery shipments, it shall make the appropriate tariff filings as required by the General Order.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

ORTIZ BROTHERS TRUCKING, INC. Original Page 1 (a California corporation)

Ortiz Brothers Trucking, Inc., by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to conduct operations as a cement carrier as defined in Section 214.1 of the Public Utilities Code, from any and all points of origin to any and all points in the counties of Santa Barbara and Ventura.

## Restriction:

This certificate of public convenience and necessity shall lapse and terminate if not exercised for a period of one year.
