SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Southern Pacific Transportation Company has requested use of Crossing No. AA-52.1-C, Cordelia Road, authorized by Decision No. 83053, before the automatic crossing protection is installed.

The request states that the crossing will be completed in advance of the installation of the automatic protection. The industry is extremely anxious to receive service over this track. The railroad states the temporary crossing protection will be two Standard No. 1R signs and all movements over the crossing will be protected by a member of the train crew until automatic protection can be placed in service.

IT IS ORDERED that for a period not to exceed one year from the date of this order protection for Cordelia Road crossing (No. AA-52.1-C) may be two Standard No. 1R signs (General Order No. 75-C) and no on-rail vehicle shall be operated over said crossing unless it shall first be brought to a stop and traffic on the roadway protected by a member of the crew or other competent employee of the railroad acting as flagman. Written instructions shall be issued by the railroad to trainmen, operating over said crossing, to comply with said flagging instructions. Copy of said instructions shall be filed with the Commission within thirty days after installation of said crossing. Flagging procedures outlined herein shall remain in full force until automatic protection required by Decision No. 83053 is installed.

In all other respects Decision No. 83053 shall remain in full force and effect.
