Petition of California Freezing &
Cold Storage Company to Revoke
Prescriptive Operating Right as a
Food Warehouseman.

O P I N I O N

Kathryn F. Console, doing business as California Freezing &
Cold Storage Company, requests revocation of a prescriptive right
authorizing operations as a public utility warehouseman in Watsonville.
The authority was set forth in Commission order dated August 16, 1960
in Case No. 6813.

It is alleged that for the past three years applicant has
been providing service for only one account, Watsonville Canning &
Frozen Food Company, an affiliated company; that all of applicant's
facilities have been transformed into freezing facilities to meet the
demands of its affiliate; and that the proposed revocation would have
no adverse public effect.

After consideration the Commission finds that public
convenience and necessity no longer require applicant's services as
a public utility warehouseman in the city of Watsonville. A public
hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Kathryn F. Console, doing business as California Freezing & Cold Storage Company, may discontinue operations as a public utility warehouseman in the city of Watsonville and the prescriptive authority as set forth in Commission order dated August 16, 1960 in Case No. 6813 is hereby revoked.

2. Jack L. Dawson, Agent, is hereby authorized and directed to cancel the participation of California Freezing & Cold Storage Company from the involved tariffs of California Warehouse Tariff Bureau on file with the Commission, such cancellation to be made within 90 days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

The Secretary is directed to mail a copy of this order to Jack L. Dawson, Agent.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
