OPINION AND ORDER MODIFYING PRIOR ORDER AND DENYING REHEARING

On August 22, 1974, San Mateo County Medical Society and Mr. Gene C. Taylor (defendants) filed an application for rehearing of Decision No. 83298, issued August 12, 1974, in which we found defendants in contempt for disobedience of the cease and desist order issued in Decision No. 82386 on January 22, 1974.

The execution of that contempt order has been stayed upon petition of defendants during the pendency of this application for rehearing.

Upon our review of defendants' application for rehearing, the Commission believes that good cause for rehearing of the Commission's decision holding Medical Society in contempt has not been shown. However, the Commission is of the opinion that certain of defendants' allegations concerning Mr. Taylor are meritorious and that the charge of contempt against that individual should be dismissed. We do so for the reason that the record does not

substantiate that Mr. Taylor acted contemptuously of the Commission's order.

IT IS ORDERED that the charge of contempt against Gene C. Taylor is hereby dismissed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in all other respects the application for rehearing is hereby denied.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that on or before October 30, 1974, Medical Society shall pay a fine in the sum of \$500, payable to the Secretary of the Commission.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the stay issued in Decision No. 83376 is hereby dissolved as against Medical Society.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
