SECOND ORDER OF TEMPORARY SUSPENSION

By Decision No. 83297 dated August 12, 1974, Sierra Pacific Airlines was granted authority to suspend temporarily service between Burbank and Fresno and Mammoth/Bishop for a period of 90 days because of very light travel during the summer months.

In a Petition for Modification filed November 8, 1974, the airline has requested authority to continue the suspension for another 12 days. The airline plans to resume service between the points in question on November 22, 1974.

After consideration the Commission finds and concludes that a temporary suspension should be granted as set forth in the order below.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing service between Burbank and Fresno and between Fresno and Mammoth/Bishop granted by Decision No. 82718 dated April 9, 1974 is hereby suspended until November 22, 1974.

2. All tariffs presently on file with this Commission referring to service between Burbank and Fresno and between Fresno and Mammoth/Bishop are suspended until November 22, 1974.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
