ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This application requested a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate passenger buses between various points in Newberry Park, Thousand Oaks, and the San Fernando Valley, on the one hand, and certain places of employment in the Hawthorne, Redondo Beach, and El Segundo areas, on the other hand.

Southern California Rapid Transit District protested the application.

In April of 1974, the applicant notified the Commission by letter that it did not wish to proceed with the application at that time because of unavailability of equipment.

On August 28, 1974, the Commission sent a letter to applicant's attorney of record requesting the applicant to notify the Commission within 30 days whether it wished to proceed with the application, and stating that if such notification was not received within that time, an order of dismissal would issue. No such notification was received.

The applicant having demonstrated no continuing interest in this application,
